MAYORAL COLUMN

Welcome to the Wanneroo Link, our fortnightly communication with City residents.

This month, the Wanneroo community has an opportunity to join in the fight for safer City roads through the RAC's Risky Roads campaign. The campaign aims to increase awareness about road safety by encouraging people to nominate the most dangerous roads and intersections in Western Australia.

I would urge you to take this chance to highlight potentially dangerous stretches of road in our City. You can do so by visiting the RAC website - www.rac.com.au

One area of great concern to the Council is the single carriageway on Wanneroo Road between Joondalup Drive and Menchetti Road - we will continue to lobby the State Government to provide funding for a dual carriageway and make this dangerous stretch of highway safer for everyone.

Also in the safety spotlight this month is the temporary closure of the Dewars beach track in Two Rocks. City administration made a decision to close the track following an assessment which highlighted serious safety concerns.

Council recognises this is an unpopular decision with some members of the community who utilise the beach area for four-wheel-driving, however the safety of our residents must remain the priority.

Council is now investigating a range of options to see what can be done to provide safe and legal access in the area, and a special council meeting will be held on Monday 14 April 2014.

Last week I personally visited the coastal protection works at Quinns Beach which are continuing, with construction of the sand bag and rock revetment to safeguard the area against severe erosion.

In addition to the revetment, Council has authorised the construction of a limestone wall at Fred Stubbs Park. All work is scheduled for completion by the end of May and I know the local community is looking forward to being able to use the facilities in the coming months.



KIDS' LIFE AT KINGSWAY

Local children can now explore a new playground as a further complement to the Kingsway Regional Playground's six stage redevelopment project.

The playground incorporates nature-based play and adventure, harmonised with conventional play equipment, and is located in between the soccer pitches and cricket oval.

The highlight of the playground is a playable art feature named 'ozraptor'. Little adventurers can also unearth a replica dinosaur skeleton buried in a secret spot within the playground boundaries.

Other popular objects include a giant bird nest swing and interactive sound sculptures.

The playground also features a slide, limestone stepping stones with timber logs and boulders,

while secure fencing surrounds an integrated path network using concrete, pine bark mulch and compacted limestone.

The main playground is complemented by two new smaller playgrounds at the cricket and football ovals, bringing passive recreation options to the heavily used active recreation elements existing at the complex.

The City is committed to providing the best facilities to our community, contributing \$593,250 to the project, while the remaining \$212,000 was covered by a Lotterywest grant.
