# HARD HAT CHAT


#### BRAZIER ROAD / WILKIE AVENUE INTERSECTION, YANCHEP

Temporary road closures will be in place from Tuesday, 15 October to Wednesday, 6 November to allow for the construction of a roundabout at the above intersection.

Brazier Road will be closed to through traffic north of Kaiber Avenue, and Wilkie Avenue will be closed west of Kaiber Avenue. The closed sections will be open to local traffic only, and signage will outline detours.

#### ALEXANDER / MARANGAROO DRIVES

Work on the intersection upgrade has begun, as part of the State Black Spot program. Construction includes left turn lanes on Alexander Drive (south) and Marangaroo Drive (east), plus installation of a traffic control signal mast arm on the approach to the intersection. The project is expected to be completed by early December.









# CITY COMMITTED TO THE ENVIRONMENT - RANGER ROY TACKLES ILLEGAL DUMPING

Illegal dumping has always been a big concern for the City of Wanneroo, as well as for many residents.

One of the City's dedicated rangers, Roy Bone, is particularly passionate about identifying offenders.

Ranger Roy regularly patrols known 'hot spot' locations, with a keen eye for new material that has been dumped.

"Whilst performing a recent routine patrol, Ranger Roy noticed a large amount of newly dumped material," Wanneroo Mayor Tracey Roberts said.

"As the City did not have cameras deployed at this particular location, Ranger Roy continued his investigations without the aid of footage and was able to identify the offender through other means."

Due to the quantity of material dumped in multiple locations, the offender was issued with an infringement of \$800, and was also required to meet Ranger Roy on site and remove the waste they had dumped.

"Offenders have been warned – do not dump your waste illegally, or you will be caught," Mayor Roberts said. "I applaud Ranger Roy for his tireless efforts to find the offender and get this mess cleaned up."

If you witness illegal dumping taking place, report it to the hotline on 1300 766 541, or the City's Rangers on 9405 5000 during office hours or 1300 138 393 after hours.

If possible, take note of:

- Date, time and place the offence was committed.
- Description of the offender.
- Vehicle make, model, colour and registration.
- Type of litter or nature of the illegal dumping.

#### LEGAL WAYS TO DISPOSE OF WASTE

- Weekly bin collections for general household rubbish and fortnightly bin collections for household recyclables.
- Mindarie Regional Council Tamala Park waste management facility is open daily for general waste and domestic household rubbish.
- Wangara Green Waste Recycling Facility accepts tree loppings, garden prunings and lawn clippings. Access to the site is free with a 'green voucher' four of which are included in the annual rates notice for residents.

# RECYCLING: WHAT CAN AND CAN'T GO IN MY RECYCLE BIN?

The City of Wanneroo provides a fortnightly domestic kerb-side recycling collection service to help create a sustainable and healthy environment.

The recyclables are sorted by hand at the City's Materials Recovery Facility, therefore it is vital that residents do not compromise the health and safety of the staff by putting incorrect items in the bin.

Putting out incorrect materials for recycling contaminates the correct materials and results in the service becoming more expensive, less effective and hazardous for our employees.

Here are a few important rules to remember for recycling:

#### Recyclables to be put IN recycle bins

- Clean glass bottles and jars (lids removed) -NO BROKEN GLASS
- All clean paper (not bundled)
- Cardboard clean pizza boxes, egg boxes, toilet roll tubes, cereal boxes, beer/drink cartons
- Paperboard cartons juice cartons, milk cartons – (rinsed and flattened)
- Plastic bottles milk, cordial, ice-cream, yoghurt, margarine, health supplements, cleaning products, hygiene products (rinsed with lids removed)
- Aluminium cans, clean foil and pie/takeaway trays (rinsed)

- Steel food and pet food cans (rinsed)
- Empty aerosols, paint cans (cleaned and dried)

# Recyclables to place NEXT to recycle bins

- Car batteries
- Used engine oil (should be placed next to the yellow lid bin in it's original character upto 5L)

#### **NON-RECYCLABLES**

- Syringes
- Chemicals
- Nappies
- Gas bottles
- Clothes/Shoes
- Toys
- Plastic bags
- Bubble wrap
- Polystyrene
- · Planks of wood
- Grass clippings/ green waste
- Electrical items, phones, computers
- Ceramic plates, cups
- Food scraps

#### **REMEMBER:**

- All recyclables should be placed loose into the recycling bin.
- Do not put recyclables inside plastic bags as these are deemed as 'rubbish'.
- Household batteries go to special collection points at City of Wanneroo Civic Centre and City libraries.
- Mobile phones can be taken to the City of Wanneroo Civic Centre or your nearest participating Post Office
