

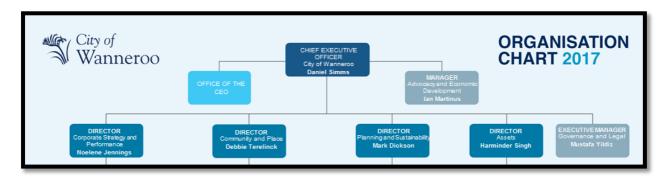
Freedom of Information Act 1992 - Information Statement

Efforts are being made to change processes and storage of documents to reflect this new electronic record format. Many older documents whose processes have not yet changed will retain their original format.
