As the Executive Officer of the WBA, I feel we have achieved much including doubling the membership base of the association since 2008, developing an interactive website, increasing the association's revenue by \$72,100 from 2007 to 2014. On a personal level, whilst working at the Wanneroo Business Association, I was honoured to be awarded at the Nifnex Influential 100 Awards 2015.

Q: How did receiving the Nifnex Influential 100 Awards 2015 change your professional career?

<u>Bev</u>: Winning the Nifnex Influential 100 Awards 2015 has given me an insight as to how much the business community does appreciate and what we do and the support offered.
