DEWARS TRACK UPDATE

Council has voted to close Dewars Track in Two Rocks after long term illegal use resulted in safety risks. The track, which runs across two private properties, will be closed from 15 January 2016. The City received many complaints from residents over the past year about repeated misuse of the track.

COASTAL PATROLS

New coastal ranger patrols were launched on 19 December 2015 to increase ranger presence within our communities. The coastal rangers will work in pairs from Fridays to Sundays until April, keeping an eye on the 4WD access at Dewars Track and the City's increasingly popular northern beaches.
