



Celebrations underway at the Wanneroo Showgrounds as 800 residents became Australian citizens at the largest ceremony in the nation on Australia Day.

The City of Wanneroo hosted the largest citizenship ceremony in the country on Australia Day, with 800 residents from 49 different countries receiving their Australian citizenship.

The event was officiated by Mayor Tracey Roberts and distinguished guests included WA Premier

Colin Barnett and Opposition Leader Mark McGowan.

“As Mayor, I am extremely proud that so many people from across the globe choose to live in the City of Wanneroo,” Mayor Roberts said.

“It is easy to see why we are the largest growing local government area, with 7,000 new residents each year.”

This year’s event featured special guest speaker Jenny Davis, recently announced as the 2016 Juniper Champion at the WA Seniors Awards in recognition of her ongoing work with Agelink Theatre, which she established in 1993.

The organisation provides intergenerational and interactive

theatre productions based on the oral histories and recollections of seniors.

Role of Government in service station approvals

Resident concerns about two new service station sites in the Wanneroo Town Centre precinct renews the focus on the role of the State Government’s Development Assessment Panels (DAPs) in approving such developments.

The State Government in 2011 created Development Assessment Panels (DAPs) to determine certain

applications in place of previous decision makers, typically a local Council and/or the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC).

DAPs report directly to the Minister for Planning, acting as independent decision-making bodies.

As reported in local media last year the site on the corner of Wanneroo Road and Crisafulli Avenue is

contentious because the City, in its planning report to the North West DAP meeting, recommended the application be refused.

The DAP, however, approved the service station development.

Under recent Government changes to DAP Regulations the proponent was able to bypass Council as the decision-maker, because the

development had a value of more than \$2 million.

The other DAP-approved service station at 990 Wanneroo Road removed a condition proposed by the City. This would have imposed a time limit of 20 years on that particular usage.
