OVERVIEW

Paper Mountain in partnership with City of Wanneroo Gallery is seeking proposals from Emerging Aboriginal Artists for a solo exhibition in the Conference Room at the Wanneroo Library & Cultural Centre. This exhibition will take place during NAIDOC week alongside the exhibition, Montages, by Tracey Moffatt and Gary Hillberg in the main gallery from July 16th to August 26th, 2017. Selection is based on the strength of the application, suitability of the project for the space and the resolution of the ideas underpinning the artist's practice. Call out for the exhibition program is open to Western Australian Emerging Aboriginal artists practicing in all mediums and disciplines.

The exhibiting artist has the opportunity to also run artists' workshops alongside the exhibition with the support and mentorship from Paper Mountain and the City of Wanneroo Gallery.
