Wanneroo as an Economically Competitive City

"It is important to have a very cognisant vision of how the City will look over the next 20 years and I think Wanneroo has done that. It has identified mixed use activity centres as locations where it can grow clean technology industries, advanced manufacturing plausibly, but a lot of knowledge based industries. If you want to bring in college educated workers with high skill sets, having high quality urban amenities, great walkable places and public transport connectivity is critically important. So I think having that vision and district structure plans that layout that vision is key to achieving that kind of economic outcome."

Importance of Innovation for Business Creativity

"In today's market place everyone is looking for a new creative idea, so incubating that through a nurturing environment, through co-work spaces, through high-tech infrastructure, through drawing venture capitalists, things like that really will allow innovation to thrive. The City's commitment to that is a critically important part of the larger vision of clean technology, advanced manufacturing, agricultural businesses; some of the value-added jobs that are envisaged for this area."





'Grow Your City' Hackathon – 6 April 2017

As part of National Youth Week teams of students from six City of Wanneroo high schools were asked to consider how they would 'grow their city' and tackle our 100,000 new jobs challenge. Through a series of challenges each team developed and pitched their creative idea. The winning team, from Butler College and Peter Moyes Anglican Community School pitched the idea of large 3D interactive art on walls, that people could 'step into', take photos of themselves 'in' and track locations using a phone app and map.

Connect Series & Smart Cities Master Class – June to December 2017

Built around the 100,000 new jobs challenge, the City of Wanneroo 'Connect' Series is a multi-event program designed to equip business and community with insights such as connecting to global markets (Global Connect: Where to Grow?) and as well as sourcing capital and finance (Investor Connect: Where is the Money?) to fund this growth.

Local Planning Strategy – Bold Approach

The City is preparing a relatively brief initial Local Planning Strategy (LPS) that will address more immediate and short-term planning issues and ensure the progress on the preparation of a Local Planning Scheme No.3, while concurrently continuing to work on a more complex and far reaching LPS that deals with 'high end' and long term strategic planning concepts that, by their very nature, will have transformative implications for the city of Wanneroo.

The City of Wanneroo has a strong strategic economic focus and is interested in supporting bold new initiatives to tackle the 100,000 local jobs challenge.

In 2018 the City will host a Jobs Summit Part II focused on water, agribusiness and new technology.
