


## How to read the MARKYT Benchmark Matrix TM

The MARKYT Benchmark Matrix <sup>™</sup> (shown in detail overleaf) illustrates how the community rates performance on individual measures, compared to how other councils are being rated by their communities.

There are two dimensions. The vertical axis maps community perceptions of performance for individual measures relative to the average score for all measures. The horizontal axis maps performance relative to the MARKYT Industry Standards.


This line represents Council's average performance for all individual measure.
As it represents the average, around half of the service areas will be placed above the line, and around half will be positioned below the line.

Councils aim to be on the right side of this line, with performance ABOVE the MARKYT Industry Standard.


## MARKYT Community Priorities Window TM

In the City of Wanneroo's Community Priorities Window, detailed overleaf, many services are located in window B. They are high performing areas, receiving average ratings between okay and good.

Perceived strengths include rubbish and recycling services, followed by library and information services.


Moving forward, the community would like Council to prioritise playgrounds, parks and reserves, streetscapes, safety and security, traffic management, footpaths and cycleways, and sport and recreation facilities (windows F + G).

It is recommended that Council also reviews areas where the average score is below average, such as how the community is informed and consulted, youth services and facilities, planning and building approvals, economic development and value for money from rates.

The Study

## The Study

In May, the City of Wanneroo administered a MARKYT Community Scorecard to evaluate community priorities and measure Council's performance against key indicators in the Strategic Community Plan.

Previously, the City of Wanneroo conducted a CATALYSE Community Perceptions Survey by phone using an 11 point satisfaction scale. This year, in response to social changes, the City adopted a MARKYT accredited, multi-channel approach for data collection with a 5 point performance scale.


Invitations were issued to 4,000 randomly selected households (2,000 by mail and 2,000 by email).

387 residents submitted a valid response reducing the sampling error to ±5% at the 95% confidence interval.

The final dataset was weighted by age and gender to match the ABS Census population profile.

Data has been analysed using SPSS. Where sub-totals add to  $\pm 1\%$  of the parts, this is due to rounding errors to zero decimal places.

## MARKYT Industry Standards

CATALYSE has conducted Community Perceptions Surveys and MARKYT Community Scorecards for over 40 councils across WA. When three or more councils ask comparable questions, we publish the high and average (industry standard) scores to enable participating councils to recognise and learn from industry leaders. ### How to read this report

Trend analysis shows how performance varies over time.

Please note: Prior to 2017 performance results are from phone surveys using an 11 point satisfaction scale. 2017 results use a MARKYT accredited multichannel approach with a 5 point performance scale. This is a best practice approach that enables comparison with other councils.

For the agree-disagree questions, the scale has remained consistent.

The chart shows community perceptions of performance on a five point scale from excellent to terrible.

The **Performance Index Score** is a score out of 100 using the following formula:



**Variance across the community** shows how results vary across the community based on the Performance Index Score

**Council Score** is the Council's performance index score.



## Frequency of using public transport














## Mix and diversity of housing types in your local area







## **Streetscapes**

Residents believe green, tidy and well-maintained streetscapes contribute to a positive and welcoming community feel. At the moment, residents suggest that certain areas detract from this feel due to poorly maintained median strips, unkempt residential verges and littered shopping areas. Residents request that Council focuses on beautifying streetscapes and encouraging residents and shopping centres to keep their property looking inviting.

"More needs to be done to tidy up and beautify the roads, verges and median strips. More native trees need to be planted and properly maintained."

"Maintenance on median strips etc. could be greater. Weeds left to grow and looks horrible."

"Providing an increase in service to making streetscapes and landscapes aesthetically pleasing for ALL areas in the City (rather than just the areas that have been there for many years)."

"To encourage residents along Wanneroo Road to maintain their front yards in a tidy condition. Have a competition or strict enforcement."

"Actively work towards reducing rubbish and shopping trolleys in streets, e.g. add rubbish bins to every bus stop, more local schools involved in 'clean up' projects around their school...More trees in nature strips and reminders to residents they can have a free verge tree planted."

"Encouraging residents of Girrawheen to take pride in the appearance of their homes by setting a good example of keeping/assisting with cleaning of retail areas. The two main shopping areas of Girrawheen are constantly messy with poor landscaping and large amounts of litter on the ground."

"Verges to be managed better forcing home owners to clean up."

"Badly maintained gardens and verges, cars, trucks, boat and trailers, caravans in our suburb (in driveways, on verges, in the streets) shopping trollies left."



## Playgrounds, parks and reserves

Residents would like more fresh, safe and well-maintained parks and playgrounds throughout Wanneroo. There is a perception among respondents that their suburbs are particularly overlooked in this area. Suggested improvements include regular maintenance of green areas and play equipment, installation of toilets, barbecues, seating and shade, and more bins and doggy bags to ensure clean and hygienic parks.

"Wanneroo is okay but park maintenance needs fixing. Play equipment poor condition as well as soft fall rubber poor. No spider treatment carried out at playgrounds. Lawn not mowed or weeded regularly. Bare minimum done to parks."

"Due to the smaller blocks and no backyards, I would love to see the old playgrounds in Butler updated to attract the children to play on them. Something along the lines of nature playgrounds to help them get in touch with the environment, and scooter and bike tracks."

"The parks in Merriwa are terrible. I live across the road from Davlik Park and the play equipment is run down and dangerous. It is rusted, covered in graffiti, often broken and there is no shade at all."

"I feel sorry for families with young children, they have no bbqs in any of our parks and no primary school in Ridgewood. Yet all other suburbs are being built with extensive parks (climbing frames, water park, etc.) and yet Ridgewood doesn't even have one bbg."

"Public open [space] in Landsdale is a joke that needs to be addressed as a matter of urgency.

Disgraceful to have lived in the City of Wanneroo for 7 years and not a park within walking distance."

"Toilets in parks and recreation centres. Please get some or make some. I have grandchildren that I take to the park and play areas. None have toilets."

"Provide more doggy bags so parks aren't littered with dog faeces."

"Playgrounds and parks need more rubbish bins plus chairs and...undercover seating with tables. All the sand should be removed from play areas and replaced with the harder surface that you see around. The sand is full of glass and syringes, not to mention animal droppings."



## Safety and security

Personal safety, vandalism, burglary and hooning are concerns for the community. Residents want a greater feeling of security especially at night, on the streets and with their children. To address this issue, they suggest greater police and security presence, CCTV installation, improved street lighting and a faster response to concerned calls.

"More police presence in the community, I don't feel safe here, especially at night, the street lights are shocking, they are few and far between, a lot of them don't work, we don't go out when it's dark, to walk the dogs or walk to the shops."

"There needs to be some form of security driving around as there are children and adults who cause issues with stealing from our homes vandalizing etc. which has become a major issue for me."

"When residents report concerns of safety or disturbing behavior in neighbourhood to follow this up on a timely manner. When police are called due to Wanneroo Council not following up on breaches this is not acceptable."

"Safety of residents, I have not seen 1 security patrol in my area, even after numerous noise complaints at 3am in the morning."

"Security in the area is very important to me as I have two young children."

"Focus on safety and security of the residents of Wanneroo. More police."

"...More importantly the increase in crime (by youth) in our suburbs - increased policing helps but only for a while."

"More cameras for walk through alleyways."

"Hoon issues particularly at night time."

"Cameras on roundabouts, the hoons are terrible."



# Traffic management on local roads

Delays associated with traffic congestion are a frustration for residents. Marmion Avenue appears to be the busiest and most congested road for residents, especially during scheduled works. Residents would like to see better flow, easier freeway access and more dual carriageways constructed, and they are eager for the Freeway to be extended.

"Traffic decongestion, dual carriageway and better freeway access."

"Traffic management around road construction. Keep 40 where active work is performed, so people keep to it. Adjust it for other areas. Too many people speed as they don't think it matters to keep to 40."

"I've been stuck in 2 major lots of traffic congestion during peak hour on Marmion Avenue due to road works. This is endangering the safety of the workers as I could see people getting very angry in their cars and also caused a 20 min. delay getting to work both times."

"Turning left onto Marmion Ave from Catalina needs a traffic light in peak hour AM from 5am. However, once (and when) the Freeway is opened it should reduce this need as it will be easier for me to get to my workplace."

"Traffic flow i.e. rail extension to Yanchep, Freeway extension to Yanchep. The traffic on Marmion Ave in Jindalee is heavy most of the time now. It takes ages to get onto Marmion Ave, and then it can be really slow to Burns Beach Road."

"Traffic on Wanneroo Road is terrible and need to remove roundabouts in high traffic areas."

"Back street lighting and widening roads from one lane to two lanes before they get congested with traffic like Marmion Ave between Butler and Yanchep, that should have been done 5-10 years ago."



# Footpaths and cycleways

Accessing main community hubs such as shopping centres and recreation areas on foot is important for residents. They request better connected footpaths and footbridges over busy roads to allow safe and easy access. Respondents would also like to see existing footpaths and cycleways better maintained by removing glass, litter and rubbish and trimming overhanging trees.

"Footpaths and cycleways. Living in Hocking, it is noted there is no SAFE place to cross Wanneroo Road to access Lake Joondalup between the town site and Ocean Reef Road. It would be good to have an underpass / bridge or two. It is also noted that footpaths have a habit of stopping in the middle of nowhere, leaving pedestrians exposed and UNSAFE."

"As there is increasing traffic on Joondalup Drive, access across the road to both the Carramar and Banksia Grove Shopping Centres by pedestrians is becoming increasingly more difficult. Perhaps footbridges could be considered by Council to enable safe crossing of the road at those points."

"In my area, pathways linked better especially to access Landsdale Farm on Evandale Road."

"I would like to see the coastal footpaths and accesses to the beach clear and tidy."

"The City of Wanneroo seems to forget the older areas and neglect footpaths, parks and overhanging trees over roads and footpaths."

"Trimming the bushes along the footpaths along Joondalup Drive after Pinjar Road. They're often overgrown making it unsafe for cyclists and pedestrians."

"In my area of Clarkson there is a lot of broken glass on footpaths and I feel there is not enough cleaning up of the footpaths."

"Keep the cycle lanes clean so the debris doesn't create punctures in my tyres."



# Sport and recreation facilities

Residents across many demographic groups including youth, young parents and seniors would like access to better sport and recreation facilities. Requests include outdoor exercise equipment, facilities for parents and children, more for teenagers, activities for seniors and cheaper exercise options. Residents suggest looking at examples from other local councils.

"Build exercise equipment in parks, like in the City of Stirling."

"More activities for babies/children. I use City of Joondalup and travel 20 minutes to do swimming, kindy gym, ballet etc. because COW doesn't have availability or doesn't do it."

"Providing facilities and services for mums with young children and babies so that they feel supported to attend to their mental health needs, e.g. Health and fitness programs with crèche facilities."

"I live in Landsdale and in 2 years I will probably retire and to help me through my life from then on I would like to be close by recreation. For example, at the Government School Hall, if they have one - Bingo Night and dance learning days or nights and craft making days."


"Exercise classes for over 60s during evening hours."

"More facilities for teenagers, i.e. ice skating, roller skating...bowling, indoor sports."

"Establishments for youths to be physical, like desperate need for squash courts in the northern suburbs and sporting establishments like Joondalup Arena in the northern suburbs."

"Also Aquamotion is too expensive - it is much much cheaper at the Stirling area facility...They have off-peak fees much less than standard fees, and even their standard fees are much cheaper than City of Wanneroo."

"More council owned gyms and group fitness (Les Mills) in the Catalina/Clarkson/Mindarie area, not just overpriced and overfull private gyms."

Overall, the City of Wanneroo in on par with the MARKYT Industry Standard for local councils in Western Australia.


As a **place to live**, the performance index score is 70, **trending up**, and now just 4 index points below the MARKYT Industry Standard.

As a **governing organisation**, the performance index score has stayed fairly steady at **60**; 5 index points **above the MARKYT Industry Standard**.

The City of Wanneroo has perceived strengths in waste and library services. Relative to the MARKYT Industry Standards, the City of Wanneroo is performing above average with its festivals, events and cultural activities, and in meeting the community's housing needs.

Moving forward the community would like the City of Wanneroo to focus on 6 key priorities:

- 1. Playgrounds, parks and reserves
- 2. Streetscapes
- 3. Safety and security
- 4. Traffic management
- 5. Footpaths and cycleways
- 6. Sport and recreation facilities





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
