Introducing the new bins on the block

Our new three bin system helps everyone get waste to the right place. We've changed the colour of our bin lids to cut the confusion and meet Australian standards. By using our bins correctly we help keep precious resources out of landfill and protect our environment for future generations.

Not sure which bin to put it in? Download the Recycle Right app!

The Recycle Right app is a simple and convenient way of finding out which bin to put things in. It features:

- Which Bin find out at a glance, what goes in which bin along with what doesn't belong there and the correct methods of disposal.
- An A-Z list of specific items telling you how to dispose of them properly.
- Find My Nearest allows you to locate and get directions to your closest recycling centre or drop-off point in the Perth metro area for items such as batteries, car parts, household hazardous waste and more.

Hello, I'm 'R'!





ANNUAL BULK HARD WASTE COLLECTION

The City provides an annual bulk waste verge collection. Waste should be placed on the verge no earlier than one week before scheduled collection. Please check your collection dates by visiting wanneroo.wa.gov.au/bulkwaste. Collection crews will not return if you miss your collection.



WASTE SERVICES GUIDE

WASTE COLLECTION REQUIREMENTS

Presenting your bins for collection



Place bins out by 6am on your collection day



Maximum weight of each bin is 70kg



Do not park in front of bins and keep laneways clear

Return your bin to its storage location within your property boundary as soon after collection as possible



Keep at least 1 metre clear from trees and not under tree canopy



Keep at least 1 metre clear between bins



Keep at least 1 metre clear of cars, mailboxes and fences etc



Presenting your bulk waste for collection





- Keep footpaths, laneways and driveways clear. If your property is situated in a laneway, please place bulk waste in one of the visitor car bays at the front of your home.
- Please place waste at least 1 metre away from fences, walls, trees, mail boxes, public utilities, power domes, water meters and sprinklers to avoid damage.
- Do not place items on light coloured paving and artificial turf. To avoid vehicles leaving marks or causing damage, we cannot collect material placed on these surfaces.
- If you are unsure of where to place your waste for collection, contact the City on 9405 5000.

- √ Food waste
- ✓ Unrepairable clothing
- ✓ Nappies/sanitary items
- √ Shredded/dirty paper
- ✓ Dirty cardboard (flattened)
- ✓ Animal droppings and pet poo
