

## Lifetime registration best option for furry friends

Did you know that more than 1000 animals come to the City of Wanneroo's Animal Care Centre each year because their owners cannot be easily contacted?

Registering your pet with the City of Wanneroo is the simplest way to ensure your pet gets home quickly and safely should they wander.

If your pet is found by one of our Rangers and is wearing a current registration tag, the City of Wanneroo will contact you and arrange to reunite you with your four legged friend.

Pet registrations for 2018 expired on 31 October and renewals were issued for all registered animals in early October. Approximately 60 per cent of renewals remain outstanding, making it difficult for City officers to track down owners of wandering pets.

Lifetime pet registration is cost effective, and a great way to ensure

you never have to worry about another renewal notice for your much loved pet.

The annual registration fee for a sterilised cat or dog is \$20 a year or \$100 for a lifetime.

A 50 per cent discount is available to those with a seniors' card, as well as a pensioner concession card, State concession card or Commonwealth seniors' card.

Mayor Tracey Roberts said people may shy away from lifetime registrations if they are considering moving home.

"However, owners who move house within Western Australia can simply transfer their dog registration to the new Council, free of charge," Mayor Roberts said.

"As a dog owner myself, I certainly know first-hand that lifetime



registration is not only cost effective but also convenient."

By law, all dogs aged three months and over must be registered, microchipped, and wear a registration tag and disc showing the owner's name and address.

Cats aged six months and over must be registered, microchipped and sterilised.

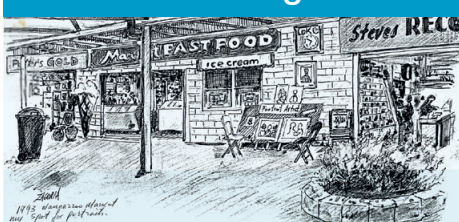
#### Wanneroo Christmas Lunch
