The City of Wanneroo has welcomed four returning and four new members to Council following the Local Government Elections on Saturday 19 October.

Councillors were sworn in at a ceremony at the City's Civic Centre after a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony in the Jacaranda Amphitheatre.

Tracey Roberts who was re-elected as Mayor, welcomed the new members to Council.

"This Council reflects the diversity of the many communities within the City and that knowledge will be valuable for the City's interactions with residents and businesses," Mayor Roberts said.

"I would also like to thank our departing Councillors who have done a wonderful job representing their communities."

Election results

North Coast Ward

Quinns Rocks resident Natalie Sangalli returns for a second term, having served as councillor since 2015 and as Deputy Mayor from 2017-2019.

Joining Cr Sangalli is newly-elected council member Chris Baker.

Central Ward

A resident of the City of Wanneroo for over 50 years, re-elected Cr Frank Cvitan first joined the Council in 1999 and again in 2011.

Wanneroo resident Jacqueline Huntley was also elected.

Cr Huntley is the founder of Toastmasters Wanneroo and, as a former driving instructor, a passionate supporter of road safety. Cr Cvitan and Cr Huntley are looking forward to working with sitting Central Ward councillors Dot Newton and Paul Miles.

South Ward

Marangaroo resident Brett Treby has served as a City of Wanneroo councillor since 1999, and will once again represent the South Ward.

Joining Cr Treby is Girrawheen resident Vinh Nguyen, a lawyer and school board member who is

passionate about youth education and committed to being a local voice for local matters.

Glynis Parker, who previously represented the North Coast Ward from 2013 to 2017, was also elected.

Cr Parker's priorities are community safety and ensuring residents have creative, age-appropriate parks, community centres, sporting spaces and libraries.

These three councillors will represent the South Ward with sitting members Domenic Zappa and Hugh Nguyen.

\$33,500 raised for local school chaplains

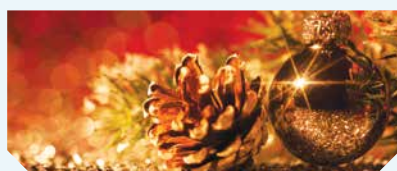
Mayor's Christmas Appeal 2019
