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TENDER 23010 PLANTING AND MAINTENANCE SERVICES AT OFFSET, CONSERVATION AND FORESHORE RESERVES

Issue

To consider Tender No: 23010 for the Planting and Maintenance Services at Offset, Conservation and Foreshore Reserves.

Background

The City has a requirement for a contractor to undertake planting and maintenance services within Offset sites, Conservation and Foreshore reserves. Contracts to provide services to these areas have been in place since 2010.

Due to the imminent expiry of the current Contract (Contract 19012) on 30 April 2023 and there being no contract extension provisions remaining, it is necessary to reestablish term contract service provision arrangements.

Detail

Tender 23010 for the Planting and Maintenance Services at Offset, Conservation and Foreshore Reserves was advertised on 28 January 2023 and closed on 14 February 2023. No Addenda were issued.

All tenderers must meet the City's minimum requirements for each of the mandatory qualitative criteria detailed (*) above.

All tender submissions received were conforming.

Pricing is not included in the qualitative criteria and is considered as part of the overall value for money assessment.

Evaluation Criteria 1 – Sustainable Procurement (20%)

Evidence of Sustainable (Corporate Social Responsibility) Procurement was assessed based on the Tenderer's responses provided to the Questionnaires within Schedules 3A, 3B, 3C and 3D which formed part of the tender documentation.

Sub Criteria a) Environmental Considerations (5%)

The City is committed to procuring goods and services that provide positive environmental, social and economic impacts over the entire life cycle of a product or service. Respondents are encouraged to provide credentials of any environmental claims of the goods and/or services submitted in this tender.

Sub Criteria b) Buy Local (10%)

An assessment was made based on the response provided, detailing the following information:

- Location of tenderer's offices and workshops;
- Residential addresses of staff and company addresses of subcontractors;
- Purchasing arrangements through local businesses;
- Requirement for new employees arising from award of the contract.

Sub Criteria c) Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) (2.5%)

An assessment was made to determine the ranking based on the responses provided that relate to:

- RELATIONSHIPS building positive relationships between indigenous and non-indigenous people;
- RESPECT recognising the contribution of Indigenous people to Australia and learning more about the history, culture and diversity in a two-way communication process;
- OPPORTUNITIES attracting, developing and retaining organisational talent to build opportunities for aboriginal employment, training, and development and mentoring.

- People with disabilities receiving the same level and quality of service from staff as other people receive;
- People with disabilities having the same opportunities as other people to make complaints;
- People with disabilities having the same opportunities as other people to participate in any employment opportunities.

Enterprise Risk Management Considerations

Financial and Performance Risk

Financial Risk

A financial risk assessment was undertaken as part of the tender evaluation process and the outcome of this independent assessment advised that Workpower Inc has been assessed with a 'very strong' financial capacity to meet the requirements of the contract.

Performance Risk

Workpower is the current contractor with no incidents or disputes recorded against the contract.

Workpower has performed the works required on time and to an acceptable standard and independent reference checks also confirm that Workpower are performing at an acceptable level with other Local Government Authorities' contracts.

Policy Implications

Tenders were invited in accordance with the requirements of the City's Purchasing Policy.

Financial (Budget) Implications

Operational Budget:

The estimated costs for Schedules 1C and 1E, associated with Tender 23010 are to be included in the 2022/23, 2023/24 & 2024/2025 Operational Budgets.

Capital Works:

Based on the tenderer's schedule of rates, the cost for tender works is accommodated under multiple projects in the existing 2022/23 & proposed 2023/24 capital works budgets.

Recommendation:

That the Acting Chief Executive Officer, in accordance with Delegation 1.1.13 -Choice of Most Advantageous Tender of the Delegated Authority Register for the awarding of tenders ACCEPTS the tender submitted by Workpower Incorporated for Tender 23010, for Planting And Maintenance Services at Offset, Conservation and Foreshore Reserves, as per the schedule of rates in the tender submission subject to appropriate funding availability, for each of the financial years within the initial 2 year contract term and further options to extend at the City's discretion.
