

Sidney Nolan Exhibition in Wanneroo



The Wanneroo Library and Cultural Centre is about to host the exclusive Sidney Nolan exhibition 'The Gallipoli Series'.

Nolan spent 20 years working on a series of paintings that were inspired by the Gallipoli campaign and underpinned by personal tragedy, and today 80 of those striking works are featured in The Gallipoli Series.

Providing new insights into Australia's military history and identity, The Gallipoli Series is a special travelling exhibition from the Australian War Memorial.

Wanneroo Mayor Tracey Roberts said the City was thrilled to host the exhibition.

"It really is a significant coup that the City will be showing Nolan's works here in Wanneroo - the only showing in the Perth metropolitan area," she said.

Back to school parking

The 2012 school year is about to begin, which means the roads surrounding local schools will be busy again during drop off and pick up times.

Parents and carers need to ensure they park their cars legally, for the safety of students as well as to help ease parking issues at schools.

City of Wanneroo Rangers will be carrying out a four-week program at local schools, educating parents how to park correctly and avoid a fine.

"The first two weeks of the school term our Rangers will be talking to parents and handing out brochures on how to park safely at our schools," Mayor Tracey Roberts said.

"If drivers are doing the wrong thing, Rangers will give them a warning, but following that, parking prohibitions will be enforced for the safety of the children."

Avoid a Parking Fine

Parking prohibitions are imposed to regulate and modify parking patterns. Essentially, there are two types of prohibitions under the Road Traffic Code - No Stopping and No Parking.

No Parking - a motorist may stop the vehicle to immediately set down or pick up passengers, and the driver must remain with the vehicle.

No Stopping - a motorist cannot stop to set down or pick up passengers.

Penalties may apply for:

- Parking in a No Stopping area
- Stopping or parking on a footpath
- Parking in a No Parking area
- Double parking
- Parking on a nature strip or verge without the owner's consent
- Parking in a way that obstructs a public place
- Parking the wrong way against traffic flow
- Parking on a median strip
