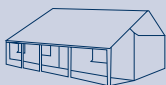

COCKMAN HOUSE

Cockman House is the oldest surviving residence in the Wanneroo region. Built in 1860 by James Cockman, the house has been beautifully restored to the era prior to 1920 and now reflects the history of the Cockman family. This stonewalled five-room house in a rural setting is a fine example of dwellings of the pioneer phases of settlement.

Ocean Reef Road, Woodvale
(west of Wanneroo Road)

Opening hours:

Sundays from 2pm to 5pm
(closed in February)

BUCKINGHAM HOUSE

This 1880 four-room cottage is typical of the rural cottages of its era. Built by the Buckingham family, it is now used as a Heritage Activity Centre, which operates an education program for primary school groups. There are occasional special open days for general admission.
