CCTV - KEEPING OUR SUBURBS SAFE



FEDERAL JUSTICE MINISTER
BRENDAN O'CONNOR OFFICIALLY
LAUNCHED THE CITY OF
WANNEROO'S EXTENSIVE
COMMUNITY SAFETY NETWORK
RECENTLY.

Twenty-four CCTV cameras have been installed throughout the City, with eight in the Wanneroo townsite, six in Clarkson and five in both Girrawheen and Marangaroo.

Four of the ranger and community safety vehicles have also been equipped with mobile camera systems, which are used in the Community Safety Patrol Service.

Wanneroo Mayor Jon Kelly said the introduction of CCTV to the City of Wanneroo was thanks to an initial \$1 million grant from the Commonwealth Government's Safer Suburbs Plan.

"This year's City's Budget has allocated \$200,000 to expand and maintain the system, which is already helping investigations into a range of crimes," Mayor Kelly said.

"The CCTV Monitoring Room has large monitoring screens and several work screens which can call up footage from any part of the camera network. Snapshots can be taken of the images and if there is an incident they are emailed immediately to police."

Mayor Kelly said the CCTV systems made it easier to detect and record anti-social behaviour and criminal activities, and also acted as a deterrent to crime.

Mayor Jon Kelly took the Minister on a tour which included the CCTV Monitoring Room as well as the ranger and community safety vehicles which has been equipped with mobile camera systems.

"This is another example of a strong partnership project between various agencies all with one objective, and that is community safety," Mayor Kelly said.

Minister O'Connor congratulated the City and said it was a valuable crime prevention initiative.

The CCTV cameras would provide the ability to detect and record anti-social behaviour and criminal activities to maximise the opportunity of apprehension and prosecution.

FIRE STATION OFFICIALLY OPENED

THE QUINNS ROCKS VOLUNTEER BUSH FIRE STATION WAS OFFICIALLY OPENED IN OCTOBER BY CITY OF WANNEROO MAYOR JON KELLY AND FESA REPRESENTATIVES AFTER ALMOST SIX YEARS OF PLANNING, FUNDRAISING AND NEGOTIATING.

Almost 80 people attended the opening which included City of Wanneroo Councillors, career and volunteer firefighters.

In his speech to the crowd, Mayor Kelly talked about the importance of volunteer firefighters, describing them as **“women and men who live ordinary lives and do something extraordinary”**.

The City and the WA Planning Commission originally approved plans for the new station in 2006 but the project hit funding hitches.

The City provided the land, the station was built jointly with money from the federal and state governments, funds raised by the brigade and donations from companies such as Red Ink Homes.

Mayor Kelly said the new station would house about 60 volunteer fire-fighters and four fire trucks.

THE CITY OF WANNEROO IS PREPARING FOR A DANGEROUS FIRE SEASON WITH THE CITY'S FIVE VOLUNTEER FIRE BRIGADES ALREADY ATTENDING TO ALMOST 70 EMERGENCY CALL OUTS SINCE JULY.

Chief Bush Fire Control Officer Mike Teraci said this was a significant increase from the 17 call outs received at the same time last year.

“Weather predictions from the Bureau of Meteorology is that we are in for a long, hot summer so with that comes fires,” he said.

Mr Teraci said that due to the dry weather, the grass was nearly 100 per cent cured which means the City is about six to eight weeks ahead of where it would be from previous years.

“Due to the unusual weather conditions the volunteer fire brigade has not been able to conduct a lot of hazard reduction burns,” he said.

“Also the volunteers have been busy up skilling their fire fighting skills ready for a busy fire season.”

Mr Teraci said the Volunteer Fire Brigade trained more than 45 new fire recruits in the first weekend in November to boost



numbers in the five brigades within the City of Wanneroo.

Additionally, the City installed new fire danger signs in November to reflect the new national fire danger ratings throughout Australia.

“Rangers started their fire break inspections in mid November,” Mr Teraci said.

City of Wanneroo property owners are required to clear firebreaks by 15 November each year and maintain them until the following April.



- From 16 November each year, firebreak inspections are carried out by the City's Rangers/Fire Control Officers on all vacant urban land and rural properties.
- **1 October - 30 September** - burning permits are required.
- **1 December - 31 March** - burning is prohibited.

Under the Bush Fires Act 1954, failing to comply with regulations can result in a fine ranging from \$250 to \$250,000 or imprisonment.

BRIGHT FUTURE AHEAD FOR YANCHEP SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB

THE CITY OF WANNEROO IS EXPECTING TO HOST A MEETING IN FEBRUARY REGARDING THE DESIGN OF THE YANCHEP SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB.

A project brief for the proposed Yanchep Surf Life Saving Club building has been drafted in consultation with the Club President, based on the club's functional requirements.

The City has also received the Beach Safety Audit from Surf Life Saving WA, which indicated a preferred location for the clubroom at the current site.

A final decision will be made with consideration to community consultation, planning approvals, environmental and heritage impacts. As a result of these matters, design may change due to any imposed site constraints.

WESCO ROAD, NOWERGUP

The \$500,000 upgrade of Wesco Road includes cutting and modifying the crest as well as reconstructing the road pavement.

This latest stage of the Wesco Road upgrade continues on to the east of the previously rehabilitated section.

Stage 2 of Brazier Road from just north of Lefroy Road to Fisherman's Hollow is scheduled to be completed in early December 2010.

Works on the western side include a 2.5m wide concrete dual-use path, roadside embayed parking and conservation fencing adjacent to foreshore reserves.

Some road widening on the eastern side is needed to accommodate the new alignment of the dual-use path.

MIRRABOOKA AVENUE EXTENSION, LANDSDALE

Construction of the \$3.5 million Mirrabooka Avenue single carriageway extension from Hepburn Avenue to Gngangara Road is on schedule to be completed by late January 2011.

Tony Martin Way and Denman Gardens have been permanently closed at their intersections with Mirrabooka Avenue, and a realigned section of Kingsway through a new roundabout recently opened to through traffic. Modifications to Denman Gardens are expected to be completed by Christmas, allowing Kingsway to tie into Mirrabooka Avenue.

HEPBURN AVENUE DUPLICATION, LANDSDALE

Work began in November on the construction of the second carriageway of Hepburn Avenue, between Alexander Drive and Mirrabooka Avenue.

The \$2.5 million project is expected to be completed during April 2011.

OCEAN REEF ROAD EXTENSION (PRESTIGE PARADE TO ALEXANDER DRIVE), WANGARA

The tender for the construction of the final stage of the extension from Prestige Parade to Alexander Drive will close by Christmas, with tender evaluation to be undertaken in the New Year followed by a report to be prepared for Council consideration at its meeting scheduled for February 2011.

MIDGE MONITORING

The cities of Wanneroo and Joondalup, in conjunction with the Department of Environment and Conservation are monitoring Lake Joondalup to determine the level of nuisance midge at the lake.

The monitoring will continue weekly until the lake has dried at the majority of monitoring sites.

During the warmer months, adult midge numbers may be seen in high numbers, causing a nuisance problem to the local community.

The Cities of Wanneroo and Joondalup, along with the DEC, have been working with Edith Cowan University (ECU) to investigate midge at Lake Joondalup in an attempt to reduce the number of midge in an ecologically sustainable manner, without the use of chemicals.

As the research being carried out by ECU investigates long term solutions, there are times when short term solutions, such as applying a chemical pesticide, may be utilised as a last resort to reduce the numbers of midge.

CAMIRA WAY GROUYNE BEACH ACCESS

The City has submitted applications to the WA Planning Commission and to the Department of Environment and Conservation to begin developing the Council endorsed concept plans for the Camira Way groyne beach access.

QUINNS ROCKS HOMES TO BE CONNECTED

After strong lobbying from the City of Wanneroo and local residents, Quinns Rocks will finally be connected to deep sewerage.

The State Government told residents that 500 properties were expected to get infill services in the next two years. Work on the first 350 lots would start next April.

Just over \$2 million would be spent on the works this financial year and a further \$3 million in the next.

HUGHIE EDWARDS DRIVE, MERRIWA

\$90,000 from the State BlackSpot Project will be used to construct a left turn pocket in Hughie Edwards Drive at Marmion Avenue. Construction is due to start shortly.

YANCHEP OPEN SPACE PROJECT UNDERWAY

NEW SPORTING FACILITIES FOR YANCHEP, CAME A STEP CLOSER RECENTLY, WHEN SURVEY CONTRACTORS TOOK THEIR FIRST GLOBAL POSITIONING SYSTEM (GPS) READINGS FOR THE YANCHEP DISTRICT OPEN SPACE PROJECT.

Mayor Kelly, North Ward Councillors Laura Gray and Norman Hewer and Chief Executive Officer Daniel Simms were on site for the occasion.

"It's great to see the start of new facilities in the City of Wanneroo's north which is set to become one of Australia's fastest-growing regions in coming years," Mayor Kelly said.

The Open Space is in the new section of Yanchep on the northern side of Yanchep Beach Road.

Part of the Yanchep City Development, concept plans are initially for a senior sporting field.

Surveying work is now complete and a geotechnical survey is being carried out by the developer Yanchep Beach Joint Venture.

The survey looks at the underlying layers that make up the geology of the surrounding area to assess soil, rock and groundwater conditions, drainage and site preparation.

The concept design will then be prepared by the developer's consultant JDSI and upon completion at the end of November will be presented to Council for consideration.

"The first priority is to construct a senior sporting field and possibly a second senior sporting field in the future," said Cr Laura Gray.

"I understand how eager locals are to see facilities in the North Ward go ahead - and they will as the population increases - but they also have to accept that Rome was not built in a day and projects of this type take some time for proper planning.

"In this case, we are very fortunate that the developer, Yanchep Beach Joint Venture, is working proactively with the City to deliver this project in a timely manner.

"The developer also has to apply to the State Government for water and clearing licenses as well as having to plan for the protection of an Aboriginal Cultural Site near the proposed ovals where flake quartz implements have been found."

Mayor Kelly said when all these steps have been taken, the City will provide for the reticulation, turfing and construction of the change rooms.

KINGSWAY REDEVELOPMENT TAKES STRIDES AHEAD

THE \$3.1 MILLION REDEVELOPMENT OF THE RUGBY AND NORTHERN SOCCER PITCHES AT KINGSWAY REGIONAL SPORTING COMPLEX IS PROGRESSING WELL, AND IS ON TRACK TO BE COMPLETED AHEAD OF THE 2011 WINTER SEASONS.

The project involves re-orientation of the existing playing fields to create new pitches and training areas. Floodlighting, new turf and upgrades to the reticulation are also part of the works and are nearing completion.

A retaining wall is being built in front of the rugby clubrooms, which can also be used for spectator seating.

The final stages of the project include roadworks, upgrades to the car-parks, footpaths and landscaping, which will be completed during February and March 2011.

Mayor Jon Kelly said this was the fourth of a six-stage redevelopment at the sporting complex in Madeley.

"Works are progressing well with the \$24 million redevelopment of the Kingsway Regional Sporting Complex," Mayor Kelly said. **"It is such an important community facility and will only get better as the upgrades continue."**

Another important upgrade is currently in progress at Kingsway Regional Sporting Complex, with the two-stage \$3.2 million redevelopment of the netball courts.

Stage one, which included the resurfacing of the 30 eastern courts was completed earlier this year, while stage two started in November 2010.

This second stage involves the resurfacing of the 27 western courts, which is expected to be finished by March 2011.

As part of the Federal Government funding commitment to the upgrade of the netball facility, the City will also improve the landscaping to provide further amenity for court users.

This will include a new playground for children, custom-designed shelters and additional furniture.

The tender for landscaping development will be presented to Council for its consideration at its December 2010 meeting.

Subject to Council's decision the proposed start date for construction will be mid January 2011, with the project likely to be completed in early April 2011.



WANNEROO DEMONSTRATION HOMES START CONSTRUCTION

THE SLABS HAVE BEEN LAID AND BRICKWORK IS NOW UNDERWAY ON THE NEW ECOVISION SUSTAINABLE DEMONSTRATION HOMES IN TAPPING.

The two homes are a joint venture between the City of Wanneroo and Cedar Woods Properties and are being built by Benchmark Designer Homes with architectural services provided by Arcologic Design.

Wanneroo Mayor Jon Kelly said that when complete, the two homes would provide a showcase for environmental sustainability through the inclusion of eight star passive solar design principles coupled with energy efficiency and water minimisation features.

The homes also demonstrate universal access, efficient site layout and affordable design.

"The homes are expected to be complete in mid 2011 and home buyers, renovators and other interested parties will be able to take free tours of the homes to experience sustainability in action," Mayor Kelly said.

"People can expect to see eco friendly fixtures and fittings such as bamboo floors, insulated cavity bricks, photovoltaic cells, rainwater tanks and a grey water system that utilises waste water from the laundry and bathroom to water the garden," he said.

Cedar Woods' WA State Manager Stuart Duplock said the homes are a perfect fit with the company's commitment to incorporating sustainability initiatives throughout each of their developments as well as offering affordable housing solutions.

The evening was hosted at Kingsway Stadium, which was transformed from the City's premier sporting facility into a gala dinner venue for the event.

Wanneroo Mayor Jon Kelly said the City was extremely fortunate to have so many valuable volunteers.

"Volunteers are ordinary people who do something extraordinary," Mayor Kelly said.

"The City of Wanneroo has so many fantastic volunteers who support the community and the City in so many ways, from sea rescues to weeding our conservation areas to helping out in our libraries.

500 NEW CITIZENS FOR AUSTRALIA DAY

THE WANNEROO SHOWGROUNDS WILL BE FULL OF AUSSIE PRIDE ON 26 JANUARY, WITH THE CITY OF WANNEROO HOSTING A CITIZENSHIP CEREMONY FOR 500 PEOPLE.

The 2011 Australia Day ceremony will be the largest single ceremony the City has hosted, behind the combined North Metropolitan Zone ceremony held in January 2010.

Almost 2,700 people from the cities of Wanneroo, Joondalup and Stirling were sworn in as Australian citizens at Kingsway Regional Sporting Complex on that day, making it the nation's biggest ever citizenship ceremony.

Wanneroo Mayor Jon Kelly said the City of Wanneroo held citizenship ceremonies throughout the year.

"The number of citizens being sworn in at the City of Wanneroo has increased by 50 per cent over the past three years," Mayor Kelly said.

"To get through the sheer number of citizens, ceremonies are held each month



and in December, three ceremonies will be held in one day to help people receive their Australian citizenship faster.

"We know that people are extremely keen to receive their citizenship once they have approval from the Department of

Immigration, but there is generally a six-month wait for a ceremony."

By the end of 2010, 2374 City of Wanneroo residents would have become Australian citizens.

MAYOR CALLS ON RESIDENTS TO 'DOB IN A DUMPER'

THE CITY OF WANNEROO HAS ORDERED A CRACKDOWN ON LITTER - AND HAS CALLED ON RESIDENTS TO "DOB IN A DUMPER" TO HELP CURB ILLEGAL RUBBISH DUMPING IN THE CITY OF WANNEROO.

Mayor Kelly said littering and rubbish dumping were a major problem in the City and it was time to get tough.

He said he was sick and tired of opening the local paper to see more examples of irresponsible people flouting the law and "disfiguring the City" with rubbish.

"Recent comments by the Department of Environment and Conservation that pine plantations and bush near Pinjar are being used as a rubbish dump for burnt out car bodies and building rubble are disgraceful," he said.

"The same can be said of other reports of dumping near Jindalee Beach.

"As the Department said, although tip fees at Tamala Park have risen, there is no excuse for people dumping rubbish in our bushland.

"We don't know where these dumpers are coming from but we need to have evidence or catch them in the act."

Littering is an offence under the provisions of the Litter Act 1979, and attracts a fine of

\$1,000, or an infringement of \$200.

Mayor Kelly said the City's Rangers would be cracking down, stretching from Koondoola to Two Rocks; the City was so big that they could not be expected to find it all.

"As fast as authorities and residents are cleaning up in one place, rubbish is being found dumped somewhere else," he said.

"This is heartbreaking after all the support the City and responsible residents give to Clean Up Australia and other community clean-up days.

"We need the community to help by calling 1300 138 393 to report suspicious activity related to dumping of rubbish and cars. The City can then contact the relevant authorities and call in the Police if required.

"I know that the Australian tradition is not to dob but we need to catch the culprits responsible for this illegal dumping. It's just not on."

In the period 1 January 2010 to 1 November 2010, Rangers have attended to 587 customer requests relating to litter incidents, issuing 29 infringements and 29 cautions.

"Apart from the considerable resources involved in investigating litter complaints,

the City of Wanneroo spends approximately \$100,000 per year cleaning up litter and rubbish that has been dumped on street verges and other City owned property," Mayor Kelly said.

"This \$100,000 is money that would be better spent on community infrastructure and projects instead of being used to clean up after the act of irresponsible individuals."

Members of the community are urged to take note of the details of any person seen dumping rubbish. The description and licence number of the vehicle is a great help in tracking these people down.

ON THE VERGE OF ENHANCED STREETSCAPES

THE CITY OF WANNEROO HAS ESTABLISHED A VERGE MAINTENANCE CREW TO ENSURE OUR STREETSCAPES ARE KEPT NEAT AND TIDY AS THE CITY CONTINUES TO GROW AND THRIVE.

Two Parks Maintenance staff positions were approved in the 2010 / 2011 budget with the view to establishing the Verge Maintenance Team. \$75,000 was also allocated to purchase the plant and equipment required by the new team to beautify the City.

"Residents of the City of Wanneroo should be proud of their community and their surroundings," Mayor Jon Kelly said.

"Home owners invest a lot of time and money in the upkeep of their properties and the City of Wanneroo is investing the same resources to ensure our parks and verges are maintained for our residents to enjoy."

The new Verge Maintenance Crew will undertake the following tasks:

- Slash side verges of unkempt corner properties in streets which are local distributor classification and above.

- Slash unkempt rear verges where there is no property access.
- Clear verges for sight line issues.
- Collect litter from verges.

The crew will start work from the City's south-east border in the South Ward.

Concurrently, inspections will be undertaken in Central and North Ward suburbs to determine the extent of verge maintenance work required.

CUSTOMER SERVICE PARAMOUNT

With the privilege of being the largest growing local government in Western Australia, comes the responsibility of providing infrastructure and services to residents, something the City of Wanneroo takes very seriously.

And customer service is at the top of the list, according to Wanneroo Mayor Jon Kelly.

"The City prides itself on its customer relations," Mayor Kelly said. "We have a dedicated customer service team, who work hard to ensure they are able to respond to our residents queries as soon as possible.

"There is also an after-hours phone line, so even in emergency situations the City can be contacted."

City of Wanneroo administration staff experience extremely high call volumes, with an average of 32,500 calls per month, while customer relations officers at the Wanneroo Civic Centre serve an average of 2,200 customers each month.

Customer Relations process an average of almost 4,000 customer payment transactions per month, and one transaction can include up to 50 individual payments on one receipt.

"With a current population of 150,000 residents and about 8,000 people moving into the City each year, there are obviously a lot of queries from our residents and ratepayers," Mayor Kelly said.
