

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's)

Why has the list been prepared?

The updated list has been prepared to guide the species selection of trees for use in City public open space and road reserves, as well as commercial developments.

What is being proposed to change?

The current City of Wanneroo Street Tree Master Plan (STMP) (2005) lists tree species suitable for use in the City. This information requires updating to reflect current knowledge on suitable species. Also, the current format of four separate lists is not user friendly. The attached updated list reflects City knowledge on suitable species in line with current irrigation needs.

The four landscape zones as per the STMP (2005) have been reduced to two: coastal and non-coastal. This is for ease of use and with the recognition that the City landscape character east of Marmion Ave in terms of soil and climate is essentially similar, with microclimates being typically altered at the time of green field development and tree planting.

The intent is not to fully describe each species, as this information is readily available online.

How long is the consultation period?

The consultation period commences on 5 January 2017 and finishes on 9 February 2017.
