Councillor Column

Hi I am Cr Brett Treby and I'd like to share with you some views on the future of the South Ward which embraces the suburbs of Alexander Heights, Darch, Girrawheen, Koondoola, Landsdale, Madeley and Marangaroo.

Our families in the South Ward have easy access to, I believe, the best regional sporting facilities in the State with the recently upgraded Kingsway Sporting Complex as well as the internationally recognised Marangaroo Golf Course.

We also lay claim to vast tracts of natural bushland such as the Koondoola, Landsdale and Marangaroo Bushland Reserves which make us the envy of many. Such valuable pieces of bushland have been secured to ensure they can be enjoyed for generations to come.

The recent completion of Mirrabooka Avenue, Hartman Drive and Hepburn Avenue now means our suburbs have finally achieved a fully functioning road network, though safety and traffic treatments now become the focus.

Future growth will see the City of Wanneroo in the next few years overtake Stirling as the largest local government area by population in Western

Australia. We will remain amongst the fastest growing local governments in Australia for the foreseeable future.

The next five years will be a period of renewal and growth particularly in the South Ward, with planning for residential and infrastructure renewal in Koondoola and Girrawheen well progressed. Coupled with this, new residential developments in Landsdale, Madeley and Darch will challenge us to grasp this growth and revitalization with renewed vigour and commitment.

This infusion of new residential development will bring challenges, requiring us to be both bold and visionary as our new neighbours will bring high expectations for better shopping experiences, improved public transport services and leading edge community facilities. New and better facilities are planned to respond to this growth though more can be done.

Change is on the way, and our response to this must not only value what we have today, but improve on it to ensure our families continue to enjoy a bright and vibrant future.

HARD HAT CHAT - ROUNDABOUT UPGRADE MARMION AND HESTER AVENUES, MERRIWA/CLARKSON

The City has commenced the above upgrade as part of its approved 2012/2013 State BlackSpot Program. Works involve the construction of bypass lanes from Marmion Ave heading south, turning left into Hester Ave heading east, and from Hester Ave heading west turning left into Marmion Ave heading south.

This \$1M project is anticipated to be completed by August, 2013. Relevant traffic management signage will be in place to direct motorists through and around the work site. Please note that there will be temporary lane closures on Hester Avenue to enable the required works to be undertaken in a safe manner.
