

SELF ASSESSMENT GUIDE Is your property fire-safe or is it a fire hazard?

Answer the questions below to assess the true fire risk to your property. If you answer no to any of the following questions, then read and act on the simple solutions that follow. It is hoped that you will use this guide to prepare yourself for high fire risk times and reduce the chances of your house and property being damaged by fire and reducing the threat to human life.



Firebreaks must be maintained from 15 November to 30 April. Consult the City of Wanneroo "Protect your Home and Property from Bush Fires" leaflet for exact dates. Reducing fire hazards is your responsibility.

PENALTY – An owner or occupier of land who fails or neglects in any respect, to comply with the requirements of this notice is liable to an on-the-spot fine of \$250 or a maximum of \$5000.

DATES TO REMEMBER

- Firebreaks must be cleared by 15 November (AND KEPT CLEAR UNTIL APRIL 30)
 - Burning permits required all year round
 - Burning prohibited between 1 December to 31 March

WHEN AND HOW TO OBTAIN A FIRE PERMIT

A person in control of a fire must stay with the fire until it is completely extinguished. Permits are available from the City of Wanneroo at the following locations:

- WANNEROO ANIMAL CARE CENTRE Located at the rear of the Ashby Operations Centre, 1204 Wanneroo Road, Ashby The City's Rangers / Fire Control Officers are available to issue permits 7 days a week* from 4pm - 6pm *Except Good Friday.
- **CITY OF WANNEROO CIVIC CENTRE** 23 Dundebar Road, Wanneroo The City's Fire Control Officers / Permit Issuing Officers are available to issue permits Monday to Friday 9am - 4pm.
- **YANCHEP VOLUNTEER FIRE STATION** Bracknell Street, Yanchep. Please phone 9561 1788 prior to visiting the station.
- **TWO ROCKS VOLUNTEER FIRE BRIGADE** Captain / Fire Control Officer. Seatrees Estate, Countryside Drive, Two Rocks Please phone 0427 026 000 before attending the station.

VOLUNTEER BUSH FIRE BRIGADES

The City of Wanneroo is committed to providing an effective and efficient fire fighting service to residents living outside of FESA's metropolitan fire district. The City of Wanneroo Volunteer Bush fire Brigade consists of four brigades, Wanneroo, Quinns Rocks, Two Rocks and the Fire Support Brigade, with about 160 volunteer members who work rostered times 12 months of the year, 24 hours a day.

The brigades also assist FESA and the Department of Enviroment and Conservation (DEC) in times of emergency.
