What is Unauthorised Work?

Unauthorised work is structures that have been built or have commenced construction without the City's approval and would have required a Building Permit.

What are the consequences should I not obtain the City's approval?

Unauthorised work represents a breach of the *Building Act 2011*, which states that a person must not commence building work unless a building permit is in effect for the building work. Penalties prescribed for non-compliance under the *Building Act 2011*, start at \$50,000 for a first offence, \$75,000 for a second offence and \$100,000 for a third offence.

What do I need to submit?

A completed <u>BA13 – Application for Building Approval Certificate</u> (Residential Class 1-10 Structures Only); OR
A completed <u>BA9 – Application for Occupancy Permit</u> (Commercial Class 2-9 Structures Only)
Completed BA18 – Certificate of Building Compliance
1 x copy of all technical/supporting documents referenced in the Certificate of Building Compliance
Relevant fees (refer to page 2)
Retrospective Development Approval (if applicable, refer to the below)

Do I need Retrospective Development Approval?

Please refer to our website to confirm whether or not retrospective Development Approval is required for your existing structure. If you are unsure of whether or not the structure requires Development Approval, please contact the City's Planning Services team on 9405 5000. Please note that Retrospective Development Applications incur a fee three times greater than the standard fee and should be submitted/approved before applying for Building Approval.

What is the difference between a Certificate of Building Compliance and a Building Approval Certificate?

A Certificate of Building Compliance is issued by a registered Building Surveyor certifying that the structure complies with the applicable Building Standards. A Certificate of Building Compliance must be submitted to enable a Building Approval Certificate to be issued. A list of registered Building Surveyors is available from the Department of Commerce website. A Building Approval Certificate is issued by the Permit Authority (the City) and is essentially the Permit for the works.
