MAKE DOGGIE DOO A DON'T!

DID YOU KNOW THE AVERAGE DOG PRODUCES ABOUT 30G OF DRY WASTE EACH DAY?

Considering there are more than 27,500 dogs registered in the City of Wanneroo, you can imagine how much waste is produced over time.

The nitrogen created from this waste has negative effects on the environment and the waste itself is unhygienic for children playing in parks and residents enjoying local greenspace.

"It is up to all of us who own a dog to be responsible and pick up after our pets," Mayor Tracey Roberts said.

The City of Wanneroo has been doing its part to ensure owners pick up after their dogs, installing 82 dog bag dispensers across 43 parks, dog beaches and foreshores.

"Although we have installed these dog bag dispensers, we are still encouraging owners to bring their own dog waste bags to clean up after pets so germs are not spread, and the rest of the community can enjoy our beautiful nature areas and a healthy community for all."

Failure to pick up after your dog may result in a \$100 fine as per the Animals Local Law.
