SERVICES TO SUPPORT OUR GROWING COMMUNITY

As our population continues to grow, the City of Wanneroo is advocating strongly for increased services and support to meet the expanding needs of our residents.

Every day up to eight families move into our City, making it more important than ever to ensure our infrastructure, employment options, community services and facilities are keeping up with demand.

The City is in the process of planning its 2016/17 Budget and we are mindful of the need to continue balancing the services required by a rapidly expanding population with careful and prudent financial management. We are also engaging with other agencies to bring services to our City.

On this note, it is fantastic to welcome the Disability Services Commission's new centre for consolidated disability services in Jindalee. This will mean services previously offered from Joondalup will now be much closer to home for residents in our north coast suburbs.

This is a great example of how the positive working relationships we have with other levels of government are supporting our community.

FREEWAY EXTENSION UPDATE

Like many residents, I am extremely pleased to see progress being made on the Mitchell Freeway extension project and that we will at last have a much needed freeway within the City's boundaries. The City has been a very active advocate for improved transport links to benefit our residents, and this will be a welcome boost for our community.

Earthworks and installation of drainage will take place between Burns Beach Road and Hester Avenue until mid-year. The extension to Hester Avenue is expected to be completed by

However, the City is continuing to advocate for an extension to Romeo Road and dualling of Wanneroo Road between existing Flynn Drive and Joondalup Drive, Carramar.

HUMAN SPIRIT AWARDS

Congratulations to Norm Hewer and Derek Bowen, who were presented with Human Spirit Awards at the Blessing of the Roads event.

The annual event encourages road safety awareness for road users over the busy Easter period and is supported by emergency services.
