The City of Wanneroo is currently leading the country for residents signing the petition which is a sign of the strong support within the community and agreement that new infrastructure is vital.

NEW TECHNOLOGY IN CITY LIBRARIES

CITY OF WANNEROO LIBRARIES HAVE TAKEN A GIANT LEAP FORWARD WITH THE ROLL-OUT OF SELF-SERVE TECHNOLOGY.

Library-goers can use their normal library membership card to borrow items using the self-check stations, which feature Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology.

All library items now have RFID tags, allowing patrons to borrow multiple items at a time without scanning barcodes.

Wanneroo Mayor Tracey Roberts said there are many advantages to the new system.

"The system streamlines processes in the library for both customers and staff by reducing repetitive handling of books and making borrowing quicker and easier," Mayor Roberts said. "It also improves collection management, making it easier and faster to find misplaced items."

RFID is already used in many libraries worldwide, with the smart system highly regarded for combining security with efficiency.

Mayor Roberts said volunteers also helped make the roll-out a smooth process.

"The tagging of all library books was completed by existing staff with generous support from volunteers," she said. "Most libraries close when tagging stock and installing equipment, however we managed to keep our libraries open with minimal disturbance to patrons, so a huge thank you to our wonderful volunteers who played a big part in the process."
