The City of Wanneroo, with the Trott family, officially opened a new nature play area built in Sam Trott's honour at Warradale Park in Landsdale on Saturday.

The Warradale Park Nature Play Area was completed in August and has already become very popular with the local community.

Mayor Tracey Roberts said the memorial playground was an uplifting tribute to celebrate Sam's life.

"I know Sam's family have taken comfort watching children play and enjoying the new nature play area," Mayor Roberts said.

Firebreak Final Notice

FIREBREAKS MUST BE CLEARED BY TUESDAY 15 NOVEMBER 2016 AND KEPT CLEAR UNTIL SUNDAY 30 APRIL 2017.

Less than 2000sqm - a firebreak no less than 2m wide by 2m high is required around the perimeter and the growth on the firebreak cannot exceed 20mm high.

Greater than 2000sqm - a firebreak no less than 3 metres wide by 3 metres high is required around the perimeter and the growth on the firebreak cannot exceed 20mm high

Burning permits are required all year round. All burning is prohibited from 1 December until the 31 March each year.

This is a requirement under the Bush Fires Act Section 33.

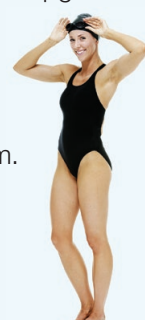
