Australia's growth councils converge in Wanneroo

The City of Wanneroo was honoured to host the 2016 National Growth Areas Alliance (NGAA) congress last week.

The NGAA represents councils from across Australia - mostly those on the outer metropolitan fringes - that are experiencing high growth pressures.

The event brought together a range of stakeholders from government and private industry to discuss their views on urban growth in outer metropolitan suburbs.

Within the next 15 years, outer areas such as the City of Wanneroo will be home to 7.5 million people.

It is therefore important for decision makers including politicians, local councils and developers to plan for this growth and address challenges now.

Connect Wanneroo

During the recent NGAA driven Fund Our Future campaign, more than 12,000 emails were sent by Wanneroo residents to politicians in Canberra calling for dedicated funding for the early extension of the freeway and rail to Yanchep. Following on from that national campaign, we have recently launched Connect Wanneroo: Get on Board. This local community campaign, supported by the City, will run until the state election in March. In less than three weeks, we have already seen almost 11,000 emails and hundreds of postcards sent to politicians and candidates standing in the March state election. Win for Seniors

Congratulations to the City's dedicated Community Services team, on winning the WA Local Government category at the recent WA Seniors Awards. The award win coincided with National Seniors Week, and

recognised the City's many and varied programs and services provided. Our seniors are very important to us, and I would like to acknowledge the valuable contribution they make to our community each and every day.

City recognised for excellence in irrigation

The City has been awarded the Irrigation Australia 'Local Government Improvement and Efficiency' Award 2016. The win was based on our commitment to reducing ground water use for irrigation by installing dosing units to active sport fields - this initiative allows wetting agents to be applied directly through sprinklers. The award also recognised our use of weather stations that determine the amount of irrigation applied, based on daily evaporation transpiration rates.

Wildcats in Wanneroo

Our City of Wanneroo Rangers took centre stage at a Perth Wildcats game at Perth Arena. The Blood Substitute, a video made in conjunction with the Australian Red Cross Blood Service, featured at the game on 13 November.

In the video, Wildcats vice-captain Greg Hire 'replaced' one of our rangers, Callum Arnold, in his duties for the day so he could be free to go make a donation. Result? Snakes and the City - important tips to note



With summer now on the way, it is prime time for snakes to start making an appearance after their winter rest period.

And contrary to popular belief, they are not limited to bushland areas. So what should you do if you come

across a snake in your home, garden or workplace?

Firstly, you should always keep a safe distance away and avoid any sudden movement which can cause them to slither away and hide.

Most importantly, keep the snake in sight. This is to ensure that a registered snake handler will be able to remove the snake as quickly as possible - and give you peace of mind that your property is safe.

City of Wanneroo Rangers are not authorised to handle snakes but a list of registered handlers in the City is available from snakecatchers.com

Full-time snake catcher Marcus Cosentino from Slithers and Slides said the most common snakes in the City of Wanneroo were Dugites (Spotted Brown Snakes) and Tiger Snakes.

"These are dangerously venomous species with bites that, if left untreated, can be fatal," Marcus said.

"Most snake bites occur when people try to catch or kill snakes, so it is very important that people leave this to the experts.

"It is also worth remembering that if visual contact is lost with the snake, there can be no guarantee it can be found again.

"Snakes have perfected running and hiding over thousands of years to evade predators, so if they slip out of the yard while you're not watching, no amount of searching on my part will find it.

"So always stay calm, keep a safe distance away and immediately call a professional snake catcher to come and remove it."

Once snakes are caught they are released back into the bush, away from homes.
