### Bee Keeping Information City of Wanneroo Bee Keeping Local Law 2016



Any person who keeps bees in the City of Wanneroo must be a registered beekeeper if required by the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Identification and Movement of Stock and Apiaries) Regulations 2013.

A permit is <u>not</u> required to keep bees in the City of Wanneroo if the land is zoned General Rural, Special Residential, Special Rural, Rural Community, Urban Deferred or Rural Resource under a local planning scheme and -

- before establishing the bee hives on the land, the occupier of the land notifies, in writing, the occupier of each property adjoining the land that the bee hives are to be kept;
- (ii) each bee hive is kept at least 10 metres from any thoroughfare (including a footpath) or public place and at least 5 metres from any other boundary of the land;
- (iii) a good and sufficient supply of water on every apiary site is provided in a way that is readily accessible to the bees on that site;
- (iv) and bees from the bee hives do not become a nuisance

A permit is **<u>not</u>** required to keep bees in the City of Wanneroo if the land is zoned <u>Residential</u> and -

- (v) no more than 2 bee hives are kept on the land;
- (vi) before establishing the bee hives on the land, the occupier of the land notifies, in writing, the occupier of each property adjoining the land that the bee hives are to be kept;
- (vii) each bee hive is kept at least 10 metres from any thoroughfare (including a footpath) or public place and at least 5 metres from any other boundary of the land;
- (viii) a good and sufficient supply of water on every apiary site is provided in a way that is readily accessible to the bees on that site; and
- (ix) bees from the bee hives do not become a nuisance.

A permit **is** required to keep bees in the City of Wanneroo if the conditions above cannot be met.

An applicant for a permit must -

- (a) be a registered beekeeper if required by the Regulations;
- (b) provide the information (including any comments from neighbours) that may be required by the local government;
- (c) apply in the form below; and
- (d) pay any application fee imposed by the local government under sections 6.16 to 6.19 of the Act.

#### Determination of application

(2) The local government may -

- (a) refuse to determine an application that does not comply with clause 2.2;
- (b) approve an application subject to any conditions that it considers appropriate; or
- (c) refuse to approve an application.

(3) The permit conditions may include that -

- each bee hive must be kept at least 10 metres from any thoroughfare (including a footpath) or public place and at least 5 metres from any other boundary of the land; and
- (b) may include that no more than 2 bee hives are to be kept.
- (4) If the local government approves an application, it is to issue to the applicant a permit in the form determined by the local government from time to time.
- (5) A permit is valid from the date of issue until it is cancelled under this local law.
- (6) A permit holder must comply with the permit conditions.

#### How the City determines if bees from bee hives are a nuisance.

A person must not keep or allow to be kept bees or beehives, or both, on land so as to create a nuisance.

The City of Wanneroo Bee Keeping Local Law 2016 defines nuisance as:

#### nuisance means -

- (a) an activity or condition which is harmful or annoying and which constitutes a reasonable basis for legal liability in the tort of public or private nuisance at law;
- (b) an unreasonable interference with the use and enjoyment of a person of his or her ownership or occupation of land; or
- (c) an interference which causes material damage to land or other property on the land affected by the interference;

Should the City receive a nuisance complaint, the following, but not limited to, criteria will be used by Health Services when investigating a nuisance:

- Affected person having documented medical support of having an allergy to bee stings
- Large numbers of bees frequenting the affected person's property and impeding their usual enjoyment of their property. For example, bees flying through a pergola, patio, swimming pool, pets drinking water container being contaminated by bees etc.
- Bees flight paths going through an affected persons backyard
- Compliance with the WA Apiarist Society Best Practice Guidelines for Urban Beekeeping
- Hives not being kept in close proximity to child and aged care facilities
- Aggressive hives not being removed or managed
- Compliance with the City's Bee Keeping Local Laws, including:
  - o Setback distances for the hives
  - Water supply provided in a sunny position and in close proximity to the bee hive (less than 5m with ability for bees to land and drink e.g. pebbles or floating material)
  - The bee keeper being registered with DAFWA if required
  - The Bee Hive being registered (branded number on box)
  - Fencing / screening measures taken to reduce a nuisance
  - The keeper having adequate education or qualifications in bee keeping

If, in the opinion of an authorised person, the bees on any land (whether or not the subject of a permit) are likely to endanger the safety of any person or create a serious public nuisance, the authorised person may give to the owner or occupier of that land a written notice requiring the owner or occupier as the case may be to remove the bees before the date specified in the notice.

## BEE KEEPING LOCAL LAW 2016 - NOTIFICATION TO ADJOINING OWNERS OF INTENT TO KEEP BEES AT (YOUR ADDRESS)

Please be advised that I am intending to keep up to two bee hives at the abovementioned property. The City of Wanneroo Bee Keeping Local Law 2016 allows up to two bee hives to be kept in a residential area without requiring a permit provided that:

- o no more than 2 bee hives are kept on the land;
- before establishing the bee hives on the land, the occupier of the land notifies, in writing, the occupier of each property adjoining the land that the bee hives are to be kept;
- each bee hive is kept at least 10 metres from any thoroughfare (including a footpath) or public place and at least 5 metres from any other boundary of the land;
- a good and sufficient supply of water on every apiary site is provided in a way that is readily accessible to the bees on that site;
- o bees from the bee hives do not become a nuisance; and
- Any person who keeps bees in the City of Wanneroo must be a registered beekeeper if required by the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Identification and Movement of Stock and Apiaries) Regulations 2013

If my bees are becoming a nuisance, please don't hesitate to contact me on (*your phone number*), so I can make the necessary modifications to reduce their impact on your property.

If you consider the bees are still a nuisance you can contact Health Services at the City of Wanneroo who will investigate the matter on your behalf.
