

Free immunisation available for residents

Did you know the City of Wanneroo offers a free immunisation service?

Many potentially life threatening childhood diseases are preventable.

Wanneroo Mayor Tracey Roberts said the City was supporting residents to access this vital service.

"The City of Wanneroo's Health Services team provides a free service for infants and children in accordance with the Western Australian Vaccination Schedule," Mayor Tracey Roberts said.

"A certified immunisation nurse administers all of the vaccines and experienced staff are available to give advice."

Immunisation clinics are held monthly at the Jenolan Way Community Centre in Merriwa and fortnightly at the Wanneroo Library and Cultural Centre, Wanneroo.

Darch resident Emma Duckworth has used the free service in Wanneroo for her son Nate's complete vaccination schedule.

"I have taken Nate to the Wanneroo clinic since his first shots as an eight-week-old baby," Mrs Duckworth said. "It makes it easy to have a location close to home, and I prefer coming to the cultural centre."

School based immunisation program for teenagers

The immunisation team will visit all high schools within the City of Wanneroo during the course of the year.

The Western Australian School Based Immunisation Program is offered to all year 8 students, with the second round of Gardasil (HPV) and varicella zoster (chicken pox) vaccines already taking place. Students have also been vaccinated for diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis.

The City will offer the Meningococcal W vaccines to year 10, 11 and 12 students during Term 3.

Young people who have left school or are up to 19 years of age can also now access this vaccine through City of Wanneroo immunisation clinics.

The Wanneroo Library and Cultural Centre Gallery is pleased to present all eight montage films by internationally acclaimed artist Tracey Moffatt and her long-time collaborator Gary Hillberg.

Tracey Moffatt is internationally regarded as one of the most important Australian artists of our time, and in 2017 became the first Australian Indigenous

artist to present a solo exhibition at the Venice Biennale.

Collaborator Gary Hillberg, who was born in Western Australia, will be hosting an artist talk this Saturday 22 July 2017.

In Conversation with Tess Woods




Celebrate *The Reading Hour* by joining with other booklovers to hear local award winning author Tess Woods as she shares her writing journey and her inspiration.
