Long awaited freeway opens inside Wanneroo

On Thursday, 3 August we welcomed the Mitchell Freeway inside our City's borders for the first time with the official opening of the Burns Beach Road to Hester Avenue extension.

The project delivered:

- Six kilometres of dual carriageway in each direction, with capacity for expansion to three lanes;
- New interchanges at Burns Beach Rd, Neerabup Rd and Hester Ave;
- Extension of Neerabup Road from Connolly Drive to Wanneroo Road;
- Widening of Hester Ave from Hidden Valley Retreat to Wanneroo Road;
- Reconfiguration of the Flynn Drive / Wanneroo Road / Neerabup Road intersection;
- Widening of Wanneroo Road from Flynn Drive to Hall Road;
- Upgrading of Joondalup Drive and Wanneroo Road intersection.

The \$236 million project lays the platform for future extension through to Yanchep and provides direct access to the Neerabup industrial area.

Thank you to everyone who shared their voice through Connect Wanneroo and the Main Roads Community Reference Group to make sure we were heard by the State and Federal governments.

Strong transport links underpin the successful growth of our City; help ensure our communities are connected; and that our neighbourhoods are vibrant, progressive and prosperous places to live.

If we get the infrastructure right, the investment and jobs will follow.

Together with approved projects for the widening of Marmion Avenue through to Yanchep Beach Road and Wanneroo Road through to

Flynn Flynn Drive and completing the widening of Wanneroo Road through to Hester Avenue, the works will deliver improved transport efficiency in the City's northern suburbs, ease congestion on local roads, improve traffic flow and stimulate investment to enhance the development of the area. Future extension of the Mitchell Freeway through to Romeo Road, Alkimos, is also a step closer to reality with Main Roads WA setting aside land for the project.

Local government first for vision impaired

Braille signage has been installed at the Dinosaur Park in Kingsway, to create a 'training site' playground for vision-impaired children.

This training site provides a safer

environment for people with vision impairment to explore, bringing about greater confidence and skill development.

"The City of Wanneroo believes in accessibility for all, and these improvements give our young residents - of all abilities - the opportunity to have fun at the Dinosaur Park," said City of Wanneroo Mayor Tracey Roberts.

"Children who are vision impaired can now play in the space through the clever use of Braille, texture, and brightly coloured equipment."

The idea for the upgrade to the park came from local resident Nancy Wilkes who suggested the improvements after her vision-impaired daughter Mia used the playground.

"The Dinosaur Park was where Mia started her therapy and because of these upgrades it has made accessing the playground so much easier and enjoyable," Ms Wilkes said.

In addition to the Braille lettering, pathways and the bridge within the playground have been fitted with sensory surfaces and directional

pavers, while the tree logs in the playground have been painted in bright primary colours to assist those with vision impairment.

The wooden decking area also has had textured lines and patterns added to them to indicate different play

The City worked in partnership with Senses Australia to upgrade the Dinosaur Park play space, as part of the City's commitment to improving access to its facilities and parks.
