Last week I was delighted to attend a launch for a fantastic book written by an inspiring young man and one of our local residents, Scott Guerini from Alkimos.

Scott is 11 years old and both wrote and illustrated his book 'Did you know you can change the world?' which tells the story of his journey to make a difference and raise funds for Telethon.

You may have already heard of Scott and his amazing efforts. When Scott was four he walked 25km from his family's farm to the nearest town because he wanted to "help sick kids and babies"; he finished the walk in 8 hours and 40 minutes.

Since then he has walked four marathons, hiked 82km across the Canadian Rockies and raised \$118,000 for Telethon.

This year, along with Scott and the rest of Western Australia, I will be celebrating Telethon's 50th year.

Scott will again be fundraising over the Telethon weekend by walking 50km on a treadmill, a great opportunity for the Wanneroo community to show its support and help Scott make a difference to the lives of those less fortunate.

City honours our much loved Pioneers



Mayor Tracey Roberts was delighted to host the annual City of Wanneroo Pioneers Function.

The City of Wanneroo's highly regarded Pioneers were honoured at a luncheon last week.

Mayor Tracey Roberts addressed the 65 Pioneers, acknowledging their collective contributions to the Wanneroo community.

"The City of Wanneroo is the wonderful, vibrant place it is today because of the incredible hard work, passion and perseverance of the Pioneers of the past," Mayor Roberts said.

"Our Pioneers truly laid the tremendous foundations on which

our great City is built.

"This annual event is one of the most revered in the City's calendar, providing an opportunity to share treasured memories of days gone by, while celebrating Wanneroo's rich and vibrant history."

Freeman of the City Margaret Cockman also spoke at the event, sharing fond memories of attending Pioneer functions over the years.

"The first Pioneers lunch was held in the Shire of Wanneroo Civic Centre on 16 August 1975, with Charles Searson officiating," Ms Cockman said.

"We found 12 eligible pioneers that first year... and over the years 262 people have been awarded Pioneer status."

The City currently has 105 living Pioneers.

Last year marked the final year that the City awarded the title Pioneer to people who had lived in the City for at least 50 years.

This decision was endorsed by the Wanneroo and Districts Historical Society.


