Golf drive sees over \$38,000 raised for charity

Firebreak notice

Firebreaks must be cleared by Wednesday 15 November 2017 and kept clear until Monday 30 April 2018.

Properties less than 2000sqm - a firebreak no less than 2m wide by 2m high is required around the perimeter and the growth on the firebreak cannot exceed 20mm high.

FIRE

Properties greater than 2000sqm - a firebreak no less than 3m wide by 3m high is required around the perimeter and the growth on the

firebreak cannot exceed 20mm high

Burning permits are required all year round. All burning is prohibited from 1 December until 31 March each year.

This is a requirement under the Bush Fires Act Section 33.
