

Celebrating Noongar Seasons

Last week the City observed National Reconciliation Week, acknowledging the contribution and celebrating the culture of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

Activities included the unveiling of new Noongar Six Seasons interpretive signage on the Lake Joondalup Foreshore in Yellagonga Regional Park (near Rotary Park).

The signage was developed in collaboration with the City's Reconciliation Action Plan Working Group and includes information on each of the six seasons in the Noongar calendar - Birak, Bunuru, Djeran, Makuru, Djilba and Kambarang - as well as information about Aboriginal culture and history within the City of Wanneroo.

Similar interpretive signage will also be installed at Marangaroo Conservation Reserve and Quinns Beach Bushland.

"The City is committed to creating an inclusive community with strong relationships across cultures, based on mutual respect and understanding so that all people are valued and participate fully in our community," said Mayor Tracey Roberts.

"I encourage all members of our community to enjoy the walking trails and take the opportunity to view the signage and learn about our City's strong links to local Aboriginal culture and history."

To commemorate the theme of National Reconciliation Week 2018,

Don't keep history a mystery: Learn. Share. Grow, Aboriginal Heritage signage at Kahana Park in Butler and Palladio Park in Clarkson will also be upgraded.

The City delivered a number of other activities and initiatives during the week designed to connect local primary school students to Aboriginal culture.

The City's Youth Centres recognised this year's theme through sharing stories, conversations and art activities.

As part of the National Reconciliation Week Street Banner Project, a banner was displayed at Elizabeth Quay showcasing the City's logo alongside this year's reconciliation theme and

With more than 4300 groundcovers, shrubs and trees to be planted, residents are encouraged to join the City's Conservation team to help rehabilitate natural areas and improve biodiversity.

Wanneroo Mayor Tracey Roberts said the planting events will take place in Madeley, Two Rocks and Quinns Rocks this year, the latter coinciding with National Tree Day.

"The annual community planting events are a great opportunity to get out and discover more about your local area," Mayor Roberts said. "Not only are you contributing towards a greener future, you will meet your neighbours and fellow community members."

Madeley residents, Glen and Bill Larcombe, have volunteered their time at Rufus Park ever since planting and weeding events began at the site, and encourage others to get involved.

"It's wonderful to see all the neighbours getting in there and helping out, especially families," Mrs Larcombe said.

"As the kids grow up, they will hopefully continue to look after the bushland."

"With a bit of care, we are maintaining the bushland in its natural state and providing a home for native wildlife, as well as adding greenery to the suburb."

Rabbit vaccination (RHDV)

Public notice

PETS

Residents are reminded to vaccinate their pet rabbits against Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease Virus (RHDV) ahead of a targeted release this spring.

The virus specifically targets wild rabbits but can also affect domestic rabbits. It does not affect humans or other animals.

The Australia Veterinary Association recommends vaccinating domestic rabbits at 10-12 weeks of age, followed by an annual booster and health check.

To further protect pet rabbits from possible RHDV1 K5 infection, owners should also ensure animals are protected through appropriate housing.
