# New fitness equipment for south ward

Several parks in the City of Wanneroo have recently been upgraded, offering residents more opportunities to get fit and healthy, while enjoying the great outdoors.

The former tennis courts at Hudson Park in Girrawheen have been resurfaced and converted into multi-purpose hard courts to include basketball backboards and netball posts. The perimeter fence has also been replaced.

The courts are free to use and open until 10pm each night, with timed push-button lighting.

Visitors to Hainsworth Park in Girrawheen and Shelvock Park in Koondoola are now able to work out on newly installed fitness equipment.

The fitness stations offer a range of exercise options at varying levels of difficulty.

The fitness equipment at Shelvock Park is located to the east of the reserve, while at Hainsworth Park the equipment is located to the south, near the children's play area.

Mayor Tracey Roberts said the park upgrades had been identified as a

result of community engagement with local residents.

"The City is committed to providing a range of recreation facilities to support an active and healthy community, and we value community feedback to help identify potential locations," Mayor Roberts said.

"I look forward to seeing Girrawheen and Koondoola residents connecting with others in the community while enjoying the outdoor fitness stations."
