On Saturday 26 January the City of Wanneroo once again held the country's largest Australia Day Citizenship Ceremony where 785 residents from 63 countries, received their Australian citizenship.

This year's ceremony was especially significant as it the marked the 70th anniversary of Australian citizenship being introduced into law, creating for the first time a legal status of being uniquely Australian.

Four City of Wanneroo residents and groups were also recognised, through the Australia Day Awards, for their momentous contribution to our community over the past year. I would like to once again congratulate them on their achievement and thank them for their dedication to our City and its people.

The 2019 award winners are:

#### Benn Marshall - Charles Searson Australia Day Youth Award

Benn was recognised for displaying outstanding community spirit through volunteer roles with multiple emergency services organisations. He has been a volunteer surf life saver with Quinns Mindarie Surf Life Saving Club for the past five years and an active member of Quinns Rocks Bush Fire Brigade for the past four years.

#### Dr Casty Nyaga - Australia Day Individual Award

Dr Nyaga was recognised for her coaching and mentoring work with local young people and other community members. She is a board member of the Kenyan Community in Western Australia and Vice President of the Organisation of African Communities.
