Last week I visited Kingsway Regional Sporting Complex with Deputy Mayor Nat Sangalli and Councillor Brett Treby to see how construction of the Wanneroo Districts Netball Association's (WDNA) new clubrooms is progressing.

Construction has been smooth and is already ahead of schedule. It is terrific that WDNA staff have been able to move into their new administration offices two months earlier than expected, to the benefit of the Association's 5,500 members. The \$3.1 million project is scheduled for completion in January 2020.

I would like to thank the State Government for its funding contribution of \$500,000 via the Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund, and WDNA President Yvette Thomson for her collaborative approach to this project.

New and upgraded sports and recreation facilities form a key part of the City's 2019/20 budget, including the construction of a new sports amenities buildings and floodlighting at a number of playing fields throughout the City.

The City is focused on delivering high-quality, long-term investments to build vibrant, connected communities and distinctive places. These projects are a direct result of our vision to create a vibrant, progressive City that provides opportunities for residents to enjoy where they live and be healthy and active.

**City invites community comments on future plans**

City of Wanneroo residents and other stakeholders are invited to have their say on the City's first ever Local Area Plans.

Draft Local Area Plans have been developed for Girrawheen and Koondoola, and Yanchep and Two Rocks, and are available for public comment until this Sunday 25 August. The plans were developed with input from more than 2,000 local people who provided comments and

ideas through the City's web-based community engagement platform Your Say, an interactive mapping tool, surveys and local face-to-face events.

"These new plans were developed as a meaningful and practical way to clearly identify the characteristics of Girrawheen and Koondoola, and Yanchep and Two Rocks that are most valued by their individual communities," City of Wanneroo Mayor Tracey Roberts said.

"Residents were also invited to share their thoughts on what future developments they would like to see in their community.

"We hope to receive feedback from as many local people as possible, so we can be sure that the Local Area Plans truly represent the community and their hopes for the future."
