



MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Mayor Tracey Roberts JP

The Western Australian Treasurer Ben Wyatt MLA delivered a resoundingly positive overview of the City's prudent financial position as a growing local government and praised its valuable contribution to the WA economy, when he spoke at the City of Wanneroo Business Breakfast on 30 August.

The City has 13,000 small businesses and securing the Treasurer to attend the Business Breakfast was an important opportunity for business leaders who attended.

The Treasurers' Keynote Address defined a confident economic outlook and he said the City of Wanneroo contributed an estimated Gross Regional Product (GRP) of

almost \$7 billion in 2017-18, which had grown by 5.3 per cent that financial year.

The Treasurer acknowledged the growth in the City of Wanneroo and the fact that since 2001, the City has grown at three times the state average.

The strength of the City's economic position was supported by the Treasurer's commendation that the City was able to meet the capital and growth demands it faces, while keeping rate rises to 1.8 per cent.

Mr Wyatt said the domestic economy was growing again after contracting for five years and that was important for job creation.

I am very proud of how the Wanneroo Business Association, the City of Wanneroo and the state and federal governments are working together to improve transport connections throughout our City.

This investment will act as a catalyst to provide local employment opportunities for our residents.

community members, planners, property developers and State Government agencies," Mayor Roberts said.

"As the City begins the process of implementing the Plan it will continue to make community consultation a top priority.

"That is why the City is forming the Community Working Group so interested people can provide input into key planning and development stages.

"The City is looking for residents who can help drive the Plan's key aims for Yanchep: Keep it Local; Keep it Special; Keep it Natural; Keep it Simple.

"I would encourage anyone who is passionate about the future of



Yanchep to submit an expression of interest to the City to be part of the Working Group."
