# TENDER 19130: THE PROVISION OF AQUAMOTION AQUATICS PLANT PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE FOR A PERIOD OF ONE (1) YEAR

#### Issue

To consider the Decline of tenders relating to Tender No: 19130 for the provision of preventative maintenance to the Aquatics plant and equipment at Wanneroo Aquamotion.

### Background

The current Contract #1638 for the Preventative Maintenance of Aquatic Plant at Wanneroo Aquamotion expires 31 October 2019. Tender 19130 was advertised to re-test the market and establish a new contract. A revised scope of works was also developed.

#### Detail

Tender 19130 for the Aquamotion aquatics plant preventative maintenance was advertised on 20 July 2019 and closed on Tuesday 6 August 2019.

# Tender Number 19130 – The Provision of Aquamotion Aquatics Plant Preventative Maintenance for a Period of One (1) Year

Tender submissions were received from the following:

### **Probity Oversight**

Oversight to the tender assessment process was undertaken by the City's Contracts Officer.

Tender submissions were evaluated in accordance with the Procurement and Evaluation Plan (PEP) which included the following selection criteria:

Item No	Description	Weighting
1	Demonstrated Experience	40%
2	Program Schedule	20%
3	OS&H Management	20%
4	Qualified Personnel	20%
5	Price	Non-Weighted

Pricing is not included in the qualitative criteria and is considered as part of the overall value for money assessment. The minimum acceptable baseline for Qualitative Criteria is set at 50% with acceptable minimum scores required for each qualitative criterion.

All submissions were deemed conforming.

#### **Overall Assessment and Comment**

Following a clarification request to the top three ranking Tenderers, to provide evidence of their current qualifications, none of the personnel as nominated in their respective tender submissions hold qualifications to the City's standard for both Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus and Work Safely with Chlorine Gas which is a key requirement in the provision of these services.

The tender submission from the fourth ranking tenderer provided no evidence of qualifications and experience as per their submission and was not considered relevant to these services.

Both Self Contained Breathing Apparatus and Work Safely with Chlorine Gas qualifications are a requirement of the Contract and therefore the recommendation is to decline all tenders received.
