

Dear Owner,

RESIDENTIAL VEHICLE CROSSOVER SUBSIDY

Congratulations on the recent approval to construct your new house. As construction will soon commence, the City wishes to take this opportunity to remind you about your obligation to construct a suitable vehicle crossover once your house is built.

It is important that the crossover meets the City's requirements and as an incentive, the City will offer a subsidy to those owners who have directly incurred a cost for the construction of their first crossover. The amount of subsidy is fifty percent (50%) of the total construction cost up to a maximum amount of three hundred and sixty dollars (\$360.00).

To be eligible to apply for this subsidy the attached Statutory Declaration must be completed and returned to this office together with an itemised receipt confirming your payment.

The Statutory Declaration is a legally binding document; therefore, it must be completed correctly.

The Statutory Declaration must include:

- ✓ **The Owner(s) Name, Address and daytime contact number indicated on the top section of the Declaration. (All owners must complete the Declaration)**
- ✓ **The construction cost of the vehicle crossover, including labour, which is to be indicated in section 4 of the Declaration.**
- ✓ **A copy of an itemised receipt indicating proof of construction value and/or a receipt for construction materials and/or a letter of confirmation of construction and cost from Builder. If providing an invoice, this must be stamped "paid in full" and signed by the Builder.**
- ✓ **The owner(s) signature in the bottom right section of the Declaration.**
- ✓ **A competent witness declaration as indicated on the rear of the Statutory Declaration. This competent witness is to sign and declare on the bottom left of the declaration. Owner(s) must not sign the Declaration without the competent witness being present.**
- ✓ **Declaration that the crossover was constructed within six (6) months of the date of this Declaration.**

Owners must ensure the crossover is installed according to Council's Vehicle Crossover Specification which can be found on the City's website at www.wanneroo.wa.gov.au. The subsidy is for **CONCRETE or BRICK PAVING**; Liquid Limestone or any other materials which are not mentioned in the City's Crossover Specifications **will not** be considered for a Subsidy.

It should be noted that the City only offers this subsidy for the construction of the first vehicle crossover to a property. Construction of additional vehicle crossovers or reconstruction of an existing complying crossover is not eligible for the subsidy.

Subsidy claims will also not be approved if the crossover construction has occurred prior to six months of the application for the crossover subsidy date. If you have a pre-existing subdivisional crossover, you are not eligible for the subsidy unless a receipt confirming your payment for the crossover and statutory declaration is provided.

Conditions of Application for Payment by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT)

1. The Vendor agrees that all EFT payments made by the City of Wanneroo are to be directed to the Bank, Branch and Bank Account quoted on the application.
2. Should any of the particulars stated on the application in respect of the Bank Account alter the Vendor must complete a new application form and forward it to the City of Wanneroo for EFT details to be updated. Until such time, the City of Wanneroo shall be entitled to rely on the details contained in this application.
3. The person signing this application warrants that he/she and the Vendor have full authority and power to enter into this agreement and that the details in this application are true and correct. The City of Wanneroo is under no obligation to verify any of the details contained in this application or the authority of the person who signed this application.
4. The Vendor acknowledges that the details set out in the completed application, must be made available to the City of Wanneroo staff in order to facilitate EFT payments.
5. The City of Wanneroo will not be responsible for any delays in banking systems in respect of the EFT payments.

Competent Witnesses
