# TENDER 20061 SUPPLY, DELIVERY AND INSTALLATION OF COIR MESH AND JUTE MATTING

#### Issue

To consider Tender No: 20061 for the Supply, Delivery and Installation of Coir Mesh and Jute Matting within the City of Wanneroo.

### **Background**

The purpose of the Tender is to provide a service to supply and install organic geotextile products, specifically coir mesh matting and jute matting. Coir and jute matting are used for erosion control at various sites throughout the City under the capital works and maintenance programs.

Services are for the supply and installation of Coir Mesh and Jute Matting where required. The quantity of works is not specified will be on an ad hoc basis.

This is a recurring contract for a period of two (2) years with two (2), twelve (12) month options to extend at the City's discretion. To date these services have been procured through period quotations.

#### Detail

Tender 20061 for the Supply, Delivery and Installation of Coir Mesh and Jute Matting was advertised on 21 March 2020 and closed on 14 April 2020. No Addenda were issued for Tender 20061.

### **Probity Oversight**

Oversight to the tender assessment process was undertaken by the City's Contracts Officer.

Tender submissions were evaluated in accordance with the Procurement and Evaluation Plan (PEP) which included the following selection criteria:

Pricing is not included in the qualitative criteria and is considered as part of the overall Value for Money (VFM) assessment. A minimum acceptable baseline for Qualitative Criteria was required together with acceptable minimum scores required for each designated qualitative criterion indicated with \* in the table above.

## Evaluation Criteria 2 - Tenderer's methodology, resources and capacity to meet the requirements of the Contract (25%)

The tenderer's resources as presented in their tender submission were assessed in order to evaluate their capacity to meet the requirements of the contract. Assessment of this criterion considered the tenderer's staff resources, vehicles, plant/equipment and workshop support to manage the contract. The assessment of this criterion has resulted in the following ranking:

Ligna failed to meet the minimum acceptable score for this evaluation criterion.

Evaluation Criteria 3 - Demonstrated Experience and Personnel performing the services\* (35%)

The tenderer's relevant experience in demonstrating the achievement of meeting client expectations as presented in their tender submission were assessed in order to evaluate their capability to meet the requirements of the contract. Assessment of this criterion considered the tendering entity's credentials to fulfil the requirements of the contract. The assessment of this criterion has resulted in the following ranking:

Ligna failed to meet the minimum acceptable score for this evaluation criterion.

Evaluation Criteria 4 - Tenderer's OSH demonstrated working documents\* (20%)

Evidence of safety and quality management policies and practices was assessed from the tender submissions. The assessment for safety management was based on the tenderers' responses to an Occupational Health and Safety Management System Questionnaire included within the tender documentation.

All tenderers provided details of their safety management systems with the following ranking:

Ligna failed to meet the minimum acceptable score for this evaluation criterion.

### Overall Qualitative Weighted Assessment and Ranking

The overall qualitative weighted assessment resulted in the following tenderer ranking:

It should be noted that Ligna failed to meet the minimum score for the mandatory qualitative criteria.

## **Evaluation Criteria Pricing for the Goods and Services Offered (Not Weighted)**

The price evaluation is based on the tendered schedule of rates and is a non-weighted assessment consideration. All tenderers priced all required line items.

An assessment was made of all tender submissions to determine the ranking based on a schedule of rates pricing assessment scenario to estimate the two year contract term total expenditure based on tenderer's submitted rates. Please refer to the Confidential Attachment for details on the pricing comparison analysis.

Based on the information provided in each submission, tenderers have been ranked as per the table below:

It should be noted that as Ligna failed to meet the minimum score requirement for the mandatory qualitative criteria they did not progress to the value for money assessment stage.

## **Overall Value for Money Assessment and Comment**

The tender submission from Workpower Incorporated achieved the highest ranking in the overall qualitative weighted assessment and satisfied the overall relative value for money assessment in accordance with the assessment criteria and weightings as detailed in the Procurement and Evaluation Plan and is therefore recommended as the successful tenderer.

#### Financial Risk

A financial risk assessment for Workpower was undertaken by the City as part of the tender evaluation process and the outcome of this independent assessment advised that Workpower Incorporated has been assessed with a 'Sound' financial capacity to meet the requirements of the contract. #### **Performance Risk**

Workpower has completed a number of contracts for the City and have performed contracted works satisfactorily.

Independent reference checks have also indicated that the recommended tenderer has performed strongly in their current contracts with the City. Please refer to the Confidential Attachment for full details of reference checks undertaken.

Tenders were invited in accordance with the requirements of the City's Purchasing Policy.

## Financial (Budget) Implications
