

Response and Recovery Fund – Guidelines

All applications must adhere to the following guidelines in order to be considered. Further information regarding eligibility criteria for each specific funding category can be found on individual application forms.

FUNDING MUST:

- assist the recovery of the local community in response to the COVID-19 pandemic;
- be utilised to enable the delivery of a service/program, or support the resilience of a group/club that benefits City of Wanneroo residents; and
- be compatible with and complementary to the City's values, strategic objectives and brand (these may be found here: https://www.wanneroo.wa.gov.au/strategiccommunityplan).

APPLICATIONS SHOULD:

- live, operate or deliver the activity within the City of Wanneroo;
- have no outstanding acquittals or debts with the City; and
- use funding solely for the purposes outlined in the application and/or by the City in the letter of offer or agreement.

Ineligible Applications

The City will NOT provide funding for activities that:

- directly or indirectly contravene existing Council policy;
- create an actual or perceived conflict of interest;
- interfere with the City's compliance with and exercise of its legislative obligations;
- conflict with the City's events program or other activities;
- are not consistent with the City's access and inclusion principles which support participation and equity for all members of the City's diverse community;
- could be perceived as benefiting a political party or campaign;
- result in direct profit or financial gain to any organisation or individual;
- are for general operational expenditure (e.g. staff salaries, lease rent payments, insurance, office equipment) purchased or provided prior to 30 June 2020;
- are to cover shortfalls or duplication in funding by state or federal government departments, including Lotterywest;
- are for the purchase of property and/or land;
- are for major/capital equipment purchases or works over \$500;
- are deemed inappropriate by the City i.e. pollution, destroy or waste non-recurring resources, illegal or political in nature;
- promote tobacco, gambling, pornography, weaponry, drugs and/or alcohol; or
- do not represent value for money for the City as determined through the assessment process.
