Have your say on Yanchep's future cycling facility

The City of Wanneroo is calling on interested residents, local cyclists and sporting clubs to have their say on concept designs for a planned cycling facility at Yanchep's Splendid Park.

The proposed purpose-built criterium track is set to wind its way around the perimeter of Splendid Park,

which already plays host to a range of sporting facilities including a soon to be completed skate park.

Wanneroo Mayor Tracey Roberts said the concept designs detailed in the master plan include four unique track options which would support training and competition, as well as a variety of other recreational pursuits,

such as skating and running.

"This will be a fantastic addition to Splendid Park and will provide even more opportunities for the community to get active and enjoy the outdoors in a great location."

"The City of Wanneroo has worked in collaboration with the Northern Beaches Cycling Club and other

key stakeholders to develop this exciting draft master plan and we're now asking for feedback from the community on the concept designs." she said.
