MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the August edition of Wanneroo Link.

In the past month, the City of Wanneroo has officially opened several exciting community facilities, including new pavilions at Edgar Griffiths Park in Wanneroo and Hudson Park in Girrawheen to the value of \$1.7 million and \$1.4 million respectively, plus a \$1.1 million changeroom extension for Madeley's Wanneroo City Soccer Club.

In addition to funding from the City of Wanneroo, each of these projects was made possible, courtesy of generous State and Federal Government contributions.

Hudson Park and Edgar Griffiths Park received \$390,000 and \$200,000 from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSC) respectively; while the Wanneroo

City Soccer changerooms received \$250,000 from DLGSC, \$150,000 from the Department of Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development and Communications and \$400,000 from the Department of Health.

The works support our local sporting groups to accommodate their growing membership bases and highlights our continuing commitment to supporting local clubs, grassroots sports and healthy, active lifestyles for residents and visitors to the City.

Spring is a wonderful time of the year and there is so much to see and do in the City of Wanneroo - from guided bush talks and walking trails to local pick-your-own strawberry farms and market gardens.

Our Parks and Conservation team will be running a series of free guided walks and bushcare days from September to November, where you can learn about local flora and fauna from an experienced guide.

Plus, our heritage houses -Cockman House in Woodvale and Buckingham House in Wanneroo are opening their doors to the public

What goes where: Using your new GO bin



Getting your waste to the right place is important to reduce what is sent to landfill, turn waste into valuable resources, and to protect the environment around us.

Your garden organics (GO) bin is exclusively for green waste from your garden - such as lawn clippings, leaves and flowers, tree cuttings, weeds, sticks, twigs and small

Properties that don't have a green bin, should continue to place garden organic material in their general waste bin.

Keep your garden organics bin clean and green by putting items in loose, not in a bag. Plastic bags, cardboard boxes and any other garden-related equipment or materials are a no-go in the GO bin.

Hocking resident Joan, an avid gardener and 'earth cycler', said she was happy to see the City send less to

"I put leaves and lawn clippings in my compost bin, but a lot of what's in the GO bin has come off the lemon tree and lime tree, which were overgrowing and had to be trimmed back," she said. "Before, that all went in the other green (rubbish) bin for the landfill and waste.

"We prefer having the new GO bin because we know it's all going to become compost."
