MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the June edition of Wanneroo Link.

I was delighted to attend the recent opening of the Allied Health Precinct on Dundebar Road in Wanneroo.

The precinct is Perth's first 'incubator', designed specifically to provide allied health professionals a space to launch and grow their business.

This impressive facility will give 27 local businesses a much needed boost and room to grow, in addition to increasing the availability of health services in the City that will greatly benefit our community.

It is wonderful to see work advancing on the \$1.7 million Dalvik Park Sports Amenities Building in Merriwa, part of the City's Capital Works Program.

The new complex will deliver change rooms, storage facilities, a kiosk, first aid room and gated outdoor area for members of our community now and into the future.

This exciting project is supported by \$400,000 from the State Government's Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund, with construction expected to conclude in May 2022.

I am pleased to announce that GO time has arrived. From 21 June, the City will start kerbside collection of the new 240-litre lime-green garden organics (GO) bins, which have been delivered to over 60,000 eligible and registered residents.

The GO bin is exclusively for green waste from the garden, such as lawn clippings, small branches, weeds, flowers, plants and leaves, which will be collected and processed into a range of high quality soil-enhancing products, such as mulches and potting mix.

We anticipate this will see 14,000 tonnes of green material transformed from waste into a resource over the next 12 months.

To ensure all our residents can access information about the recent changes to our kerbside collection service, the City has partnered with the Waste Authority to deliver a unique multilingual education resource.

The 'WasteSorted - Talking My Language' toolkit teaches participants about the importance of recycling and sorting household waste using flashcards, icons and annotations translated into 10 languages.

The City's Waste Education team will work closely with a diverse range of cultural community leaders to help them deliver educational sessions using the toolkit.

traditional Welcome To Country and Flag Raising Ceremony at the Civic Centre Amphitheatre on 9 July where the Aboriginal and Australian flags will fly side by side to signify unity.
