Happy New Year, and welcome to the first Wanneroo Link of 2022. I was very proud to officiate at three citizenship ceremonies held on Australia Day.

While this year's event was split into three smaller ceremonies, in line with current COVID safety measures, the City had the notable honour of conferring citizenship on the most people in Western Australia on Australia Day.

We welcomed over 550 people from 60 countries with the ceremonies held at Peter Moyes Anglican Community School in Mindarie. Year 12 school graduate Atida Gowha sang at the ceremonies.

Four of our amazing residents were also recognised with City of Wanneroo Australia Day Awards for their commitment to enhancing the City through their leadership and work in the community. Joseph Banks Secondary College Year 12 student **Cian Chase** was recognised with the Charles Searson Australia Day Youth Award, Tapping resident Teresa Newton received the City of Wanneroo Australia Day Award, Thomas Corcoran from Darch was presented with the City's Australia Day Senior Award and The Patricia Giles Centre for Non-Violence Wandjoo Place Mental Health Committee Working Group collected the Australia Day Community Group Award.

I would like to extend my sincere congratulations to all of our new Australian citizens and award winners.

It is set to be another busy and exciting year in the City, with several major projects taking shape.

Progress is underway on 33 projects funded under Phase 2 of the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

The funding has helped the City deliver much needed work on community and sports buildings, including accessibility improvements and upgrades to playgrounds, car parks and sports floodlighting.

It has also helped improve green spaces and upgrade transport infrastructure with new footpaths and bus shelters. As well as boosting the local economy



and jobs, these projects provide important infrastructure needed to support our growing population. Public consultation is now open on the concept plan for the new Alkimos Aquatic and Recreation Centre, which will meet increased demand and provide greater convenience for residents of our northern coastal suburbs.

I encourage everyone to have a say on the design, which features indoor and outdoor swimming pools, gym and fitness facilities, a crèche, café, change rooms and a car park.

The public comment period closes on 31 January.

This summer our events season starts with an evening under the stars, with Perth Symphony Orchestra performing at Splendid Park in Yanchep on Saturday 26 February.

You can experience the incredible sounds of the orchestra performing modern day hits at this sunset concert.

In March, we're celebrating Harmony Week with the return of the Wanneroo Festival – an exciting community event that showcases the City's rich diversity.

I look forward to celebrating with food trucks serving up a delicious array of cuisines, traditional music and dances from across the globe, and a daring drone display.
