On behalf of the City, I would like to congratulate departing Mayor Tracey Roberts on her declaration to office as the Federal Member for Pearce.

Over her 19 years of dedicated service, Tracey demonstrated a strong commitment and passion for our community and, with Council, has delivered a number of fantastic initiatives, services and facilities to benefit our growing community. We look forward to continuing to work with Tracey as the Federal Member for Pearce on projects for our community.

At its June meeting, City of Wanneroo Council resolved to hold an extraordinary election to fill the mayoral vacancy.

The Western Australian Electoral Commission will be engaged to conduct a postal vote, with the election count to occur on Friday, 2 September 2022.

The new mayor's term would expire in October 2023, when the role is due for re-election as part of the Local Government's regular election cycle.

The City has also asked the Minister for Local Government to consider exercising any powers he may have by 11 July 2022 to allow the City to leave the mayoral position vacant until the next Ordinary Election in October 2023.

The Minister has also been asked to consider that in the event of an extraordinary election in 2022, the elected Mayor remain in office until the 2025 Ordinary Election. We have requested the Minister respond by 11 July.

I would like to assure our residents and ratepayers that City services and Council procedures will continue uninterrupted during this transitional period.

NAIDOC Week kicks off this weekend and to mark the occasion the City will hold a series of community events celebrating Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, language and culture. The theme of NAIDOC Week (3 to 10 July) this year is 'Get up! Stand up! Show up!' and I encourage City residents to take the opportunity to learn more about our local Noongar history.
