I would like to thank the community for voting in the City's recent Extraordinary Mayoral Election.

It has been my privilege to serve City of Wanneroo residents as a Councillor for the past nine years.

As the City's new Mayor I am excited to continue working with mu fellow Councillors and City staff to deliver for our community.

In great news for our local sporting clubs, important upgrades were recently completed at Dalvik Park in Merriwa. The new Dalvik Park sports pavilion is the latest addition to our expanding portfolio of community sporting and recreation facilities in the City's growing suburbs.

Featuring two sets of change rooms, two universal access toilets, four storage areas, a multipurpose room, first aid room, umpire's room, kiosk and new carpark, these

upgrades will serve our community for many years to come.

This \$2.3 million project was supported by \$400,000 from the State Government's Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities

Thank you for having your say on the concept design for Dordaak Kepap, Landsdale's Library and Youth Innovation Hub.

The proposed concept for the \$10.2 million facility, which will be located at Broadview Park in Landsdale, features an open plan reading area, public meeting rooms and activity rooms, a recording studio, control booth and podcasting room, a demonstration kitchen, gaming and virtual reality space.

Dordaak Kepap (pronounced dor-dark kep-up) is a Noongar word meaning 'place of living waters'.

The City received a \$3 million State Government grant for the youth innovation hub component of the facility. Construction of Dordaak Kepap is scheduled for the 2023/24 financial year.

It's never a dull day at the Wanneroo Gallery - make sure you check out Susie Vickery's immersive and finely crafted installation 'Peregrinations of a Citizen Botanist'.

From October, the Gallery will feature unique photographic exhibition, 'Ink in the Lines'.

The exhibition showcases Australia's modern veterans, who through their tattoos commemorate the people, events and experiences that shaped their lives.
