

## **Blue Tree Request Checklist**

## - For Community Members

The Blue Tree Project raises awareness of mental wellbeing. Seeing a Blue Tree may spark difficult conversations and encourage people to speak up about mental health. By spreading the message that "it's ok to not be ok", you can help break down the stigma that's still largely attached to mental health.

	Why do you want to paint a blue tree and how will it	
	benefit the local community?	
	It is the City's preference that the painting of blue trees be	
	used to raise awareness of mental health issues in the	
	community - tree painting as a community projects or in	
	association with an event is preferable. The painting of blue	
	trees purely as a memorial will generally not be supported.	
	Have you referred to the Blue Tree Project?	
	Seek support from <u>www.bluetreeproject.com.au</u> for information	
	on tree and paint choice, how to stay safe, and other ideas.	
_	Have you found a potential tree?	
	Provide photos, maps, aerials, including surrounding area etc.	
	Where is the tree located?	
	The City is only able to approve one blue tree per suburb,	
	provide address/ location.	
	Is the tree dead?	
	Only dead trees that are not habitat for fauna will be supported.	
	How will the tree be painted?	
	Is the tree accessible, is it easy to get to and paint?	
	Can the tree be safely painted from ground level?	
	Are there residential properties in line of sight of the tree?	
	The City can only support trees that are not in visible line of	
	sight of any residential properties.	
	Have you considered a community painting day?	
	Get the community involved to help spread the message.	
	Incorporating a community painting day may make your project	
	eligible for the City's <u>Kickstarter Fund</u> .	
	How will the project be funded?	
	With the exception of the <u>Kickstarter Fund</u> , the City doesn't	
	provide financial support to paint blue trees.
