WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

- Girrawheen is one of the City's first established suburbs built between 1975 and 1990. Infrastructure is aging and the current facilities are no longer physically or socially fit for purpose.
- The existing Precinct is well utilised by the community for a wide range of activities indicating that demand for the Precinct is strong.
- The communities of Girrawheen and Koondoola are culturally diverse with 40.9% and 47.7% of residents born overseas respectively, compared to 32.2% for Western Australia and 27.7% for Australia.
- These communities are also the City's most disadvantaged with Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas (SEIFA 2021) of 858.8 and 794.7 respectively, well below the Australian average of 1001.2 and the Western Australian average of 1011.0. Koondoola has the lowest SIEFA Index of any
