

Travelling to Wanneroo





BY CAR

The City of Wanneroo is easily accessible by car. Heading north from Perth CBD on the Mitchell Freeway or Wanneroo Road, the actual Town Centre of Wanneroo is 25km from Perth. Yanchep, in the northern part of our City is approximately 55km from Perth.



BY TRAIN

Catch the Joondalup – Butler line and exit at any station north of Warwick.



BY BUS

Various bus routes link from the Perth CBD and from the main railway stations.



FROM THE AIRPORT

By car, Wanneroo is an easy drive from the airport via Tonkin and Reid Highways.

DID YOU KNOW?

Our beautiful coastline boasts pristine beaches, limestone cliffs, heathland and sand dunes with stunning coastal dining locations found along the way.

SWIM, DIVE, SURF

Our coastline is a true delight for nature lovers and perfect for beach and water sport enthusiasts. If you fancy yourself as the adventurous type, start the day challenging the waves at The Spot in Two Rocks. For a more relaxed start, opt for observing the ocean's marvels at Yanchep Lagoon, the perfect place for snorkelling. If you're heading north, be sure to stop in at Two Rocks, a peaceful coastal community, which boasts a boat harbour and a range of great eateries.

MINDARIE

Pay a visit to the Marina Mindarie with its high quality cafes and restaurants, plus a stylish microbrewery and a great pub serving sea-fresh fish and chips. Have a go at SUPing or take a kayak out in the safe Marina waters.

Tip: Book a spot on the fishing or dive boats charters that run out of the Marina.

FAMILY PLAYTIME

Many childrens playgrounds can be found along our coast with maritime themed play, from the Treasure Island playground at Alkimos, Adventure Play at Jindalee and Lighthouse Park at Amberton. Kinkuna Park at Eglinton has a water play area or if driving is your thing, try the Pitstop Park at Banksia Grove.

MARINA, MINDARIE

The Marina, Mindarie is the perfect place to head if you're looking for a variety of cafes and restaurants to choose from and a relaxed coastal vibe to enjoy. Whether you're after a weekend brunch date, freshly caught seafood, locally brewed beer or a cocktail by the cabana bar and pool you will find it all here.


DINING OUT

Discover our national parks



YANCHEP NATIONAL PARK

If you love nature, then the City of Wanneroo is the place for you with many ideal locations for a picnic, bike ride or a scenic drive.

Yanchep National Park provides a true Aussie experience only 45 minutes from Perth. Discover the location's rich history with Aboriginal culture. You can take part in a cave tour or see the flora and fauna including kangaroos and koalas. Explore any of the park's nine trails, enjoy a picnic or barbeque in the natural surrounds and perhaps stay overnight at the historic Yanchep Inn. If you're peckish, sample some sweet delights at Chocolate Drops tearooms before heading to the Visitor Centre to grab some gifts to take home.

FEELING ADVENTUROUS?

Challenge yourself on one of the ropes courses, zip lines or aerial challenges at Treetops Adventure, soaring through the trees among the kookaburras and counting the kangaroos.

Tip! Explore Perth's only underground caves with a Crystal Cave tour. You'll need to book ahead through the McNess House Visitor Centre or online at Exploreparks/Yanchep.

NEERABUP NATIONAL PARK

Neerabup National Park offers a more simple nature based escape and includes the Yaberoo Budjara Walk trail stretching 28km in total. If you're lucky, you'll witness western grey kangaroo, emus or spot the endangered Carnaby's blackcockatoos. The park is also home to other native animals such as echidnas, brushtail possums and brush wallabies.

ACTIVITIES

- 1. Take a cave tour
- 2. Pack a picnic feast or use the free BBQs
- 3. Soar through the trees at Treetops Adventure
- 4. Enjoy an Aboriginal cultural experience
- 5. Learn about the koalas





Hiscover our trails



SHIPWRECK TRAIL

Ahoy there! The maritime history of this coast is littered with tales of ships coming to grief on treacherous reefs, with signage telling stories of their fateful journeys. These days, the many remaining shipwrecks have become interesting historic artefacts and gripping dive locations.

10TH LIGHT HORSE HERITAGE TRAIL

The 10th Light Horse Regiment was stationed in Wanneroo during World War II and you can enjoy a 1.2km heritage walk around the second camp established by the regiment. The trail is located in Neerabup National Park, north of Flynn Drive and has excellent interpretive signage along the trail.

PLAY TRAILS APP

Download the Play Trails mobile app to unlock the games, solve quizzes and discover more about Wanneroo's shipwrecks, walks and heritage trails.

YANCHEP NATIONAL PARK

There are nine trails of various lengths found within the park offering something for all, such as the gentle Wetlands Walk through to something a little more adventurous like the Ghost House Trail at 12.4kms.

EAT, PICK, GROW, TRAIL

LOCAL WINES AND CRAFT BEERS

From humble beginnings in 1948, Paul Conti Wines has become one of WA's most reputable and respected boutique, family-owned wineries. Visit the cellar door at the original Conti homestead in Woodvale and even book ahead to score a table reservation at Harry's at Conti, the fine dining restaurant.

Donnelly River Wines have also established a presence in Wanneroo, with their cellar door on Wanneroo Road. Pop in for a friendly chat and a taste!

If craft beer is more your thing, the area has everything from the seasonal and on trend beers brewed at the Indian Ocean Brewing Co at Mindarie or the European and South African inspired brews found at Impi Brewers.

Tip: Head to Basil's in Mindarie for a large selection of fresh, quality and fine food. It truly is a foodies heaven.



Completed in 1860, this family home of three generations is a rare historic place of continuous residence by descendants of the original building.

LIME KILNS

The burning of limestone was a major post-war industry for this area, with huge kilns built at the time. Some of these can still be found today at Coopers Park, Mindarie and Kiln Road, Carabooda.


TIPI

Discover more about ancient cultures "KAYA TO N



'KAYA' - HELLO AND WELCOME TO NOONGAR LAND AND PEOPLE IN THE CITY OF WANNEROO.

Two Noongar language groups, the Whadjuk and Yued people, lived and shared cultural areas in the northern parts of the City of Wanneroo for traditions and customs. This region was part of Mooro Country, the district of an important Whadjuk Noongar Elder and leader Yellagonga.

Water was vital for Yellagonga's group for their survival and spiritual connections. This made Wanneroo, with the abundant food sourced on the shores of its lakes, an important environment for local Whadjuk Noongar families. They moved around the coastal sand-plain according to the six Noongar seasons, hunting and gathering as they went.

HINT:

Check out the Aboriginal Cultural experience at the Yanchep National Park (bookings required)

SIX SEASONS

There are six Noongar seasons, in Western Australia's South West region, indicated by changes in local plants and animals.


Traditionally Noongar people hunted and gathered food according to the seasons, being guided by signs in nature as to which animal and plant resources where plentiful at those times. For example a hazy summer sky tells of the salmon running or the blossom on paperbarks bringing the mullet fish.

DID YOU KNOW?

The City of Wanneroo is located within 'Noongar Country', in the south west of Western Australia (stretching from Esperance to Jurien Bay) and contains 14 different language

GOLF

Why not try one of the amazing public golf courses at Carramar or Marangaoo? If you're not up for a full game of golf, head to the the Wanneroo Botanic Gardens which has stunning subtropical gardens, including flower displays, ponds and waterfalls with two 18 hole mini golf courses, suitable for all the family.

SPORT & LEISURE

Looking to cool down, then head to Aquamotion for a dip in the indoor 25m pool or outdoor splashpad. If you're looking to let off more steam, why not visit Kingsway with aquatic dinosaurs themed play space, acres of play fields and an indoor stadium with multi sports courts available for booking.

SHOPS AND MARKETS

If shopping is your thing, there is plenty of choices from Yanchep Central, Oceans Keys, Wanneroo Central and Kingsway. The regular outdoor market at Kingsway Reserve is worth checking out for the fresh veggies, sweet treats and often music to enjoy. The original indoor Wanneroo Markets at Wangara offers an eclectic mix of gifts, homewares and fashion, as well as the best fresh veg around.

NEED FOR SPEED?

Did we mention Wanneroo is home to the Wanneroo Raceway, the 'thumping heart of west coast motorsport'?

Over the years it has seen the likes of Mark Webber on its track with his Red Bull F1, Supercars series returning yearly, and many state and national round race meets for both 2 and 4 wheeled vehicles year-round.
