Local artists take centre stage in 2025 Art Awards

Artist Anna Speirs has been awarded the top honour at the City of Wanneroo Community Art Awards, receiving the grand prize for her captivating painting, Moonlight Solitude.

Anna was among 15 talented artists who shared in a total prize pool of \$19,900.

There were 135 entries to this year's awards – 88 paintings, 21 works on paper, 13 photo, film and digital pieces and 13 sculptures.

This year's judges were Emma Bitmead, Curator of Historical Art at the Art Gallery of Western Australia; Paul Uhlman, Associate Professor and Coordinator of Visual Arts and Printmaking at Edith Cowan University; and Di Cubitt, Sessional Academic and Fine Art Unit Coordinator at Curtin University.

Mayor Linda Aitken said this year's awards once again highlighted the depth of creativity and talent within our community.

"We're proud to host this exhibition each year, celebrating local talent and providing emerging artists the opportunity to showcase their skills," she said.

"Each piece tells a story, and collectively, the exhibition reflects the diversity, imagination and passion of our community."

Australian Red Cross pop-up coming to Butler



Butler will be the next location for a four-day pop-up Lifeblood donor centre in July.

Did you know that 1 in 3 people in the City of Wanneroo will need blood in their lifetime, but only 1 in 30 people donates?

The Australian Red Cross is calling for people to donate blood during winter, to boost stocks during a time they see higher rates of people rescheduling and cancelling appointments.

The initiative is part of a year-long

WA trial that has seen Lifeblood pop-ups visit towns and suburbs to give locals the chance to give blood and save lives.

If you're aged between 18-75 years old and are feeling well, you may be eligible to donate.
