Two major City projects coming to life

Two major projects underway at opposite ends of the City have recently reached major milestones.

Steel framing is up at the Alkimos Aquatic and Recreation Centre (AARC), and the first water test has been undertaken at the centre's 'learn to swim' pool.

The project is scheduled to be completed in September 2026.

At the same time, Dordaak Kepup library and youth innovation hub in Landsdale is now in the final stages of construction, with its official opening set for December 2025.

Distinctive steel panels were recently installed - shaping the impressive exterior of the building as it edges closer to its final form.

The City is grateful to have received the following funding commitments for the AARC:

- \$30 million from the Australian Government, including \$25 million under the Priority Community Infrastructure Program and \$5 million under the Female Facilities and Water Safety Stream Program
- \$12.6 million from the State Government, including \$10 million under the WA Recovery Program, \$2.5 million from the Community Sports and Recreation Facilities Fund and \$178,792 through the Changing Places program
- \$15.2 million through the Alkimos-Eglinton Developer Contribution Plan.
- The City will contribute \$45.3 million.

Council has adopted the City's 2025/26 budget.

Our \$353.4 million budget includes the City's largest-ever capital works program - a \$132.6 million investment in local infrastructure, facilities and services.

Council adopted a 3.5 per cent rate increase across all rating categories, and a 3 per cent rate increase for residential ratepayers, which amounts to less than \$1 per week for most homeowners.

This year's budget is an ambitious yet achievable plan, building on the successful completion of last year's capital works program.

On behalf of Council and the City, I thank our community for their trust, their feedback and their continued partnership in building a stronger City of Wanneroo, for today, and for generations to come.
